Dear Fr. Connors: Is telling other people the faults of another person always a sin?

This is a great question that comes up a lot. The

Catechism of the Catholic Church provides a clear explanation.

"Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. He becomes guilty of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true, without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor; of detraction who, without objectively valid reason, discloses another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them; [and] of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them" (CCC 2477).

In other words, assuming the truth of a claim against another without sufficient reason amounts to rash judgment. Calumny refers to speaking false things about others which harm one's reputation. These seem fairly simple. Detraction can be more difficult.

Detraction refers to saying something that is true, although negative about someone else, without sufficient reason. In court, one must tell the truth including saying the crimes of another. A teacher might share the faults of a student with his parents or with the principal. A friend might share a fault of another with someone else in order to get advice on how to handle the situation. This can be difficult to know when it really is necessary to speak against another person.

The important thing to remember is that everyone has the right to a good reputation. In principle, one's faults should not be shared with others. Instead, there must be a sufficient reason—a real reason in justice or charity—in order to share this negative thing, even though it is a true statement.

The gifts of the Holy Spirit and the example of the lives of the Saints prove useful in deciphering precisely when such a fault needs to be shared with another person.

he paschal candle should stand in the sanctuary during the entire season of Easter.

This candle symbolizes the risen Christ who conquers sin and death and, for that reason, is lit during baptisms and usually at funerals as well.


Each year, a new paschal candle is prepared during the opening rites at the Easter Vigil. It is marked with a cross, an alpha and omega, and the numerals of the year. Five grains of incense, representing the wounds of Christ, are also embedded into the wax.
