#### Dear Fr. Connors: What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

St. John Paul II declared the second Sunday of Easter to be "Divine Mercy Sunday." It is an

occasion throughout the Church's year to reflect on the gift of divine mercy.

The modern devotion to divine mercy has its origin in Saint Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938). She was a Polish nun who received visions of the Lord with messages concerning His mercy. St. Faustina was the first saint canonized by Pope John Paul II in the new millennium.

Devotion to divine mercy has become especially popular in recent years. It is a custom to pray the chaplet of divine mercy at 3:00pm each day. Those prayers are prayed on traditional rosary beads with short prayers in honor of God's mercy, asking His mercy to overflow into our world.

The liturgical texts (the readings and prayers for Mass) were not changed to establish Divine Mercy Sunday. The readings and prayers of the second Sunday of Easter already expressed the theme of God's Mercy.

The Gospel for that Sunday for example provides as explicit reference to the Sacrament of Penance—which is the Sacrament of God's mercy. Our Lord tells his apostles, the first bishops and priests of the Church: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:22-23).

The Church offers a plenary indulgence—that is, the removal of all temporal punishment due to sin—to those who take part in prayers or devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy on this day. To obtain the indulgence the usual conditions still apply, namely, Confession, Holy Communion, prayers for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, and detachment from all sin.

Here at Our Lady of Mercy we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00pm on Divine Mercy Sunday with the opportunity for Confession following.
