Is it necessary to receive from the Chalice?

It is the consistent teaching of Scripture, theologians, and the Church that when a person only receives the consecrated host the person receives Christ whole and entire, body, blood, soul and divinity. Hence it is not necessary to receive both the host and the precious blood from the chalice in order to receive the fullness of grace which the Eucharist provides. As Christ tells us in Scripture: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world... He who eats this bread shall live forever."

Furthermore, the presence of Christ completely under one of the Eucharistic species finds its basis in an important theological foundation called the principle of concomitance. This states that Christ is indivisible, so that his body cannot be separated from his blood, his human soul, his divine nature, and his divine personhood. Therefore, where he is present, he is wholly present. You do not receive half of Christ when you only receive the host. To separate Christ's body or blood from the rest of him would be to re-sacrifice Christ, which is impossible. Christ died once and for all. While we call the Mass a sacrifice, it is the participation in the single and timeless sacrifice of Christ (and not a re-sacrifice of Christ as some critics claim).

Some parishes allow communicants to receive under both species. The reason for this is purely for the sign value of the act. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But 'the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly" (CCC 1390).

The reason why Holy Communion is most often given out under only one species is twofold: First, because of the respect and care given to the Eucharist. There is a greater risk of profanation should the Precious Blood be dropped than if a host were dropped. Second, the risk of thinking that the reception of both species is necessary to receive Christ whole and entire (this is known as the Utraquism heresy).

What is of utmost importance in the life of Catholics today is not completing the sign value, but ensuring that Holy Communion is received fruitfully, free from mortal sin.
