# Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

Last weekend there was a mild debate in the rectory among the priests as to what we should properly call Monday's holiday. Is it "Victory Day" or "VJ Day"? Officially it is named "Victory Day" and Rhode Island is the only state that still celebrates it as a holiday.

When I was a child it was always called "VJ Day" as it marked the surrender of Japan and the end of World War II. The day had special significance in my household as my late Father was a combat veteran of the Second World War. He fought the German Army and the Nazi regime in Italy.

My Father always told me that if Japan had not surrendered he would have been shipped to the Pacific for an invasion of Japan. Therefore, he always insisted on calling the holiday, "VJ Day." Well, no matter what we call it, what is important is that we remember its historical significance. And remember the sacrifice also made by America's Greatest Generation. They helped to defeat the hatred and violence of the fascists regimes.

How terribly sad it was to learn of last weekend's tragedy in Virginia where a group of neo-Nazis and White Supremacists gathered to publically display their racist and hateful ideas. Violence erupted and a young woman lost her life.

How very tragic and sad that such hate and violence should take place, but also as we mark the defeat of fascists in World War II. The racist message espoused by these neo-Nazis and White Supremacists is repugnant and

reprehensible. It is an affront to all right thinking Americans but especially to America's Greatest Generation who sacrificed so much to defeat the racist and hateful ideology of the Nazis.

It wasn't lost on me that as we marked Monday's civic holiday, the Church celebrated the Feast of St. Maximillian Kolbe, a Franciscan Priest who died at the hands of the Nazis at Auschwitz Concentration Camp. Inspired by the truth of Jesus Christ, St. Maximillian resisted the racist ideology of the Nazi regime with every ounce of his being. In the ultimate sacrifice, he gave up life to save a fellow prisoner from execution at the hands of their Nazi captors.

With this in mind, let us pray for end to racism, hatred, and violence of all kinds and let us reject the Nazi and bigoted ideology displayed in Virginia. News reports indicate that these Nazis are bringing their racist and hateful message to Boston this weekend. Their sinful and evil message of racism and hatred must be condemned and rejected by everyone of us.

In light of the tragedy in Virginia, Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, the President of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops issued the following statement:

"Our prayer turns to the people of Charlottesville who offered a counter example to the hate marching in the streets. Let us unite ourselves in the spirit of hope offered by the clergy, people of faith, and all people of good will who peacefully defended their city and country. We stand against the evil of racism, white supremacy and neo-Nazism. We stand with our

sisters and brothers united in the sacrifice of Jesus, by which love's victory over every form of evil is assured."

Let it be very clear that racism of all kinds and anyone one expressing hatred for another because of the color of his or her skin, is always evil. In Catholic teaching, racism is considered an intrinsic evil on par with the evils of abortion, assisted suicide, and torture.

In moral theology, this means it can never be justified. It is always, under every circumstance, evil. And the events of last weekend serve to remind us, perhaps with even more urgency now, that we are called to reject such evil and work for its end. This goes far beyond any politics. There are no two sides to this issue. There is only one side. We can only stand against the evil of racism.

St. John Paul taught us: "Racism is a sin that constitutes a serious offence against God. To oppose racism we must practice the culture of reciprocal acceptance, recognizing in every man and woman a brother or sister with whom we walk in solidarity and peace. The Church asks all believers to make their own responsible contribution of conversion of heart. "Let us unite against all racism and pray for the end of such evil and hatred.

We say "So Long" to Fr. Connors, who returns to Rome this week. Do good. Be well. God Bless! Go Sox!

#### Why do we not talk about the Devil?

The film *Usual Suspects* made famous a line by Charles Baudelaire: "The finest trick of the devil is to persuade you that he does not exist." Probably the simplest answer to this question is that people think that the devil does not exist. Very recently the head of the Jesuits, Fr. Arturo Sosa, stated that the devil was just a literary creation to represent evil.

Historically, what started as an extreme obsession with the devil in the witch hunts of Salem, Massachusetts and Protestant Northern Europe has swung to the other extreme of apathy in our own age. For our contemporary world the idea of a devil that influences our actions conflicts with our notions of unbridled freedom and self-autonomy. In such a mindset we are radically free and mistakenly think that sin and the devil have no influence in our lives. In essence we have fallen into the heresy of Pelagianism which is the idea that we save ourselves. We do not need salvation from sin and the devil that Jesus Christ gives us through the Church and her Sacraments. Finally, atheism and a world view known as Scientism argue fallaciously from advances in psychology and other scientific disciplines to presuppose that only material things exist. Granted we should not go to the opposite extreme, and give the devil too much glory and attention, and in so doing forget that ultimately we are responsible for our actions.

Yet, it is dangerous for the world to forget that the devil exists and is actively working to turn us away from God. The devil does not want us to know that he is around, since this makes souls easier to take. C.S. Lewis in the Screwtape Letters wrote, "But do remember, the only thing that matters is the extent to which you separate the man from the enemy. It does not matter how small the sins are provided that their cumulative effective is to edge the man away from the Light and out into the Nothing... Indeed the safest road to Hell is the gradual one." The devil's strategy is to turn us away from God by little sins that appear pleasant and happy to us (after all no one would do something that would make them miserable!) until we find we have descended into more serious sins (but by then we may have become blind to our spiritual status). In our fight against sin, evil, and the devil, the Sacraments are our defense.
