Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

I wish to thank the parishioners who so generously donated the new automated external defibrillators (AED) for our church and school. An AED is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest, when someone's heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops beating.

There are two located in Church, one in the OLM vestibule and one by the sacristy. We have also placed two in the school and a third is portable and brought outside when students are at gym or recess. These life-saving devices can be used by anyone with a little training. After Christmas, we will be holding training sessions for our OLM School faculty and staff, and for our OLM Ushers and Staff. The training will be open for anyone interested in learning how to use an AED.

We are truly thankful for those who were so quick and generous to support our effort to purchase the AEDs for OLM. They cost over one thousand dollars a piece, but they are an invaluable addition to our parish. In your name, I offer our sincere thanks for the donation of these life-saving AEDs.

During Advent we are called to prepare ourselves and our world with prayer and charity for the coming of the Messiah. At last Sunday's Weekly Angelus Address, Pope Francis offer this reflection on Advent. The Holy Father stated:

"Jesus exhorts us in the Gospel (Cf. Mark 13:33-37) to take heed and watch, to be ready

to receive Him the moment of his return. He says to us: "Take heed, watch and pray, for you do not know when the time will come lest He come suddenly and find you asleep" (vv. 33-36).

The person that takes heed is one that, in the noise of the world, doesn't let himself be overwhelmed by distraction or by superficiality, but lives in a full and aware way, concern first of all for others. With this attitude, we are aware of the tears and the needs of our neighbor and we can also grasp his human and spiritual capacities and qualities. The person that heeds then turns also to the world, trying to counter the indifference and cruelty in *it*."

As we continue to prepare ourselves and our world for the Messiah, let us heed the Holy Father's Advent words. Our concern for our neighbors, especially those less fortunate and in need, should be a hallmark of our anticipation of the Messiah's coming.

The Catholic Church in the United States is the largest Refugee Resettlement agency in the nation and the Diocese of Providence is the largest in the State of RI. This Advent, OLM Outreach, is looking for help in aiding several Refugee Families who have been resettled to RI.

These families are fleeing wars, famines, persecution and poverty and arrive here with only the clothing on their backs. The Diocese of Providence helps them find housing, and work. Any help you may wish to offer our efforts is truly appreciated.

We always are in need of monetary donations, and also gift cards, especially to Walmart and Stop & Shop. If you would like to help in any way, large or small, please contact Doug Green, our OLM Outreach Director.

Pope Francis reminds us that Advent calls us to turn to the world and counter its often "indifferent cruelty." We are called to prepare for Christ at Christmas not only in our own homes, but in the world around us. We can do this in all kinds of ways: helping OLM Outreach, visiting neglected neighbors or lonely relatives, volunteering at McAuley House or Emmanuel House homeless shelters.

This Advent we are bringing the *Bambinelli* Blessing to OLM. *Bambinelli* is the Italian name for Baby Jesus figurines that children bring to be blessed by the Pope. We have a small number of these beautiful figurines available for sale after Masses this weekend.

Next Sunday after the 9:00am Mass we invite you to come to Mercy Park by the parish crèche to bless the *Bambinelli*. So please join us, and bring the Baby Jesus from your own crèche to be blessed by your priests (not the Pope!). We'll have singing led by our Children's Choir, hot chocolate and donuts too! It's a great way to prepare for Christmas and celebrate *Gaudete* Sunday!

It's Advent so take heed and "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight His paths." Do good. Be well. God Bless! Go Pats!!!

How much did Mary know about Jesus?

To summarize scripture, Mary knew: (1) what she heard from Gabriel at the Annunciation (Luke 1:26–38), (2) what the angel told Joseph in his dream, presumably (Matthew 1:18–25); (3) what Elizabeth told Mary by the Holy Spirit at the Visitation (Luke 1:39–56); (4) what Gabriel told Zechariah about his own son John, (Luke 1:5–23); (5) what the shepherds told Mary at the Nativity they heard from the heavenly host (Luke 2:8–20); and (6) what Simeon and Anna told Mary at the Presentation in the Temple (Luke 2:22–38).

There is a song called "Mary did you know," that asks whether Mary knew everything that would take place. The song asks if Mary knew that "[her] Baby Boy would one day walk on water?" Did Mary know that Jesus would perform miracles? Being a pious Jew she knew the prophecies. She knew that the Messiah would perform healing miracles: cure the blind, heal the sick, have dominion over the powers of nature.

The song asks: "Did you know that your Baby Boy would save our sons and daughters?" Mary knew from the revelation of the angel that Jesus would be the Messiah, the incarnate God, the savior of the world who would die for our sins. The angel told her: "He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High..." Elizabeth greeted her with "the mother of my Lord" which refers to Jesus' divinity. She also knew the Suffering Servant prophecy of Isaiah: "But he was pierced for our sins, crushed for our iniquity. He bore the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed. We had all gone astray like sheep. Like a *lamb* led to slaughter..." Finally Simeon told her: "and you yourself a sword will pierce," to indicate the sorrow she would bear at his crucifixion.

Advent is a time to prepare for the coming of Christ and the best person to imitate is Mary; to ponder in our hearts what this all means and so when Christmas day arrives, to truly understand what takes place; the incarnation, the coming of God in the flesh for the salvation of the world.
