#### What do we mean when we say: "Do not judge?"

We have all heard the expression: "Do not judge." There has been a lot of discussion about the meaning of this phrase and we hear it again and again (Pope Francis himself stated it in one of his addresses). Very often this expression comes up when someone points out the faults of another person. Such and such a thing or an act that you did is wrong; or your lifestyle choices are wrong. Some respond with "do not judge" because they think that this means we cannot qualify another person's actions. The expression is incomplete and there are at least two ways that it can be interpreted: (1) do not judge... that a person can be saved or is in heaven or hell; (2) do not judge... the rightness or wrongness of a person's actions, or the faults of others.

Typically we take the expression in the second sense, which is a very broad meaning of it. This idea of judging others would, of course, be very problematic for our courts of law (they would cease to function if we could not judge the rightness or wrongness of a person's actions).

Actually the expression does not mean that we ignore the faults of others (in fact for St. Paul it is a grace to know our sins because by knowing them we can fix them). Instead when we say "do not judge" it merely states that we cannot know if someone is in heaven or hell. This is "judgment" in the truest sense of the word. If I was to say about someone: "such and such person is in hell." I would probably be condemned, and rightly so, for being judgmental. This is exactly what Jesus tells us not to do. Notice, however, that if I said: "such and such person is in heaven," then I would probably not be condemned as being judgmental. In fact I am being judgmental in this case as well.

It is an interesting teaching of Christ's, not to judge, that we do not often follow to its logical conclusion. Just as we cannot judge a person to be in hell, likewise we cannot judge a person to be in heaven (excluding the saints, due to the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in the Church).

Why is this? There are two reasons. The first reason is that we place ourselves in the position of God. Only God can judge, whether for hell or heaven for a person. The second reason is that we have limited knowledge. We do not have certain knowledge that a person is in heaven or hell, except for the saints because of the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and the presence of miracles. One of the consequences of this is that we always need to pray for the dead. So in short, "do not judge" refers to the possibility of salvation for someone else, but it does forbid the qualification of acts.
