

Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

I hope you had a great Fourth of July celebration. There were fireworks all over the nation and families and friends gathered for good fun and good food. This most American of holidays is a great day to remember and celebrate our nation and our freedom.

You may have noticed that the U.S. Flag flies high at OLM School. Thanks to Paul Anderson, our Maintenance Director, the flag is illuminated with light at night and so we are able to fly "Old Glory" twenty-four hours a day.

When you look at our flag flying be sure to look at the top of the flagpole. On top of the flagpole you will see the newly "ball-style" finial. In refinished your name I thank long-time OLM Parishioner, Steve Kane, who not only donated the gold leafing that the finial adorns also spent hours gently applying the gold leaf on the finial. We are truly grateful for his generosity and for sharing his time and talent on behalf of the parish.

The history of our flag is as fascinating as that of the American Republic itself. It has survived battles, inspired songs and evolved in response to the growth of the country it represents.

On June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress passed an act establishing an official flag for the new nation. The resolution stated: "Resolved, that the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white;

that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation." On Aug. 3, 1949, President Harry S. Truman officially declared June 14 as Flag Day.

The name Old Glory was given to a large, 10-by-17-foot flag by its owner, William Driver, captain from sea Massachusetts. Inspiring the common nickname for all American flags, Driver's flag is said to have survived multiple attempts to deface it during the Civil War. Driver was able to fly the flag over the Tennessee Statehouse once the war ended. It's a "Grand Old Flag" indeed!

Our new Associate Pastor, Fr. Barrow, is finding his way around the parish and the town. He has been busy getting to know the lay of the land as well as unpacking his trunk and boxes, recently arrived from Rome. I hope you got a chance to welcome him and say "Hello" last weekend. If you have not yet greeted our new priest, please do so as I know he is anxious to meet you.

Our OLM Vacation Bible School was a great success. It ended on July 1st and the over fifty children, many parent and teenaged volunteers, our Summer Seminarian Billy Burdier, Directors Doug Green and Mickey St. Jean and our OLM Youth Activities Coordinator Michael LaChimia are all to be commended for planning and running such a great faith event for the parish.

The children not only had

a week of fun and activities but also learned many valuable things about their Catholic Faith. This is a wonderful event for our young parish families and I offer my thanks to all those who helped to make it possible, and all those families who participated in the OLM VBS!

Last week we celebrated Independence Day on the Fourth of July. But just before that civic celebration, the Church marked the Feast of St. Junipero Serra, the great Missionary of the Western United States. The Franciscan Friar built the Mission Churches that span the California Coast and his statue stands tall in the U.S. Capitol. Fr. Serra was just canonized in September 2015 by Pope Francis at a Mass in Washington, DC. In his homily the Holy Father stated:



Dear Billy: What discernment advice would you give someone discerning a call to the priesthood or religious life? What I would say to someone who is discerning a call to the priesthood or religious life is trust those

feelings and thoughts. I would encourage you to pray, pray and pray. Through prayer, you can establish or further deepen your relationship with Christ, who calls us to Himself. It is important to remember that "many are called, but few are chosen." In other words, God, of course, is calling all of us to be holy, but not everyone receives the invitation or the thought about becoming a priest or entering a religious community. Also, remember that God speaks to us through our desires for the good, through our desires for Him. Those thoughts or desires are not just for fun. God is leading you and calling you to follow him. Now the question we can ask is: in what way is God asking you to follow him? If God is gifting you with this kind of curiosity, then give Him a chance. Trust me; it is never a waste of time to try to figure out what God's will for us is. Any time given to God is never a waste, and you will gain wisdom and joy. In your response and discernment, it is important that you pray, spend time with our Lord before the Blessed Sacrament and attend Mass as often as possible. Listen to what God is asking of you and have confidence in knowing that He is always by your side. Always remember that you are not alone and that others are praying for you as you discern! As we move closer to God's will for our lives, we can utter the same words of Christ: "Father... not as I will, but as you will." As we begin to grow in our love for God; as a result, we will have a growing desire for our wills to be conformed to His own. I am praying for you and do not be afraid. "God is love and perfect love cast out all fear." Your heavenly father wants the absolute best for you.

Annual Mission Co-op Appeal July 23/24, 2016 Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary



Sisters representing the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary will be with us at OLM on the weekend of July 23 and 24. The religious community was founded in Ireland in 1924 to work with women in Nigeria, West Africa. The Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary are now an international community working in nine countries of Africa as well in Brazil They are a strictly missionary and Mexico. community with no institutions in the U.S.A. or Canada. All funds go directly to support their missionary work. The founder of the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary, Bishop Joseph Shanahan, a Spiritan Priest from Tipperary, Ireland and Vicar Apostolic of Southern Nigeria, hoped to expand outreach to women in Nigeria. In February 1927, the first ten sisters made their profession as Holy Rosary Sisters. Five would continue to work on the mission of congregational growth and the formation of new members in Ireland; five would prepare to travel to Nigeria to initiate their mission. These five studied

the Igbo language and prepared to improve the livelihood of girls through a network of schools for teacher training, nursing, and technical instruction. They looked to Mary as a model for the



innate dignity of women. The Annual Mission Co-op Appeal provides support for the good works of the missions. Each year missionaries visit parishes of the Diocese of Providence to preach about their work and seek support. They look for spiritual support of the Catholics of Rhode Island through prayer and financial support with a special Second Collection. Thank you for your support.
