Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we welcome to Our Lady of Mercy Sister Josephine and Sister Therese of the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary. This is our Annual Mission Co-op weekend in which we dedicate one weekend a year to learning about the good works of Missionaries and support them with our prayers as well as our financial contributions.

A large part of the group is from St. Theresa's Church in Tiverton and so Fr. Shemek (formerly of OLM!) is leading the group that includes Deacon Brian Morris from OLM. Also attending is OLM Senior Altar Server Jack Kineke with his school group!

World Youth Day will see hundreds of thousands Catholic youth from across the globe. Pope Francis is to address the expected 2.5 million pilgrims in attendance! Prior to the World Youth the Providence Day Pilgrims are to visit Warsaw, Auschwitz and the birthplace of St. Pope John Paul the Great in Wadowice.

After the conclusion of World Youth Day, the Providence band of pilgrims are to make their way to the Jasna Gora Shrine which houses the Black Madonna icon so beloved by St. Pope John Paul.

Please pray for our pilgrims from Providence, and OLM, and also for the success of World Youth Day. It is sure to be a memorable event for all of them, and for the entire Church. Pope Francis told the pilgrims preparing for World Youth Day: "Dear young people, at the Shrine in Krakow dedicated to merciful Jesus, where he is depicted in the image venerated by the people of God, Jesus is waiting for you. Dear Billy: If God is light and in him there is no darkness why have some Saints experienced a dark night and a lack of God's presence?

As scripture says, "God is light and in him there is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5). Yet, saints, contemplatives, and mystics use expressions such as "dark night" to describe our spiritual conditions; this expression is not suggesting there is darkness in God, rather it is signifying that the light of the radiance of God is so brilliant, so overwhelming that the faculties of our mind and heart experience darkness when they come face to face with it.

Consequently, all the contemplative sense is in dark absence. An excellent example of this is St. John of the Cross; he uses the example of God being as bright as the sun. St. John says that attempting to stare at God face to face is like trying to look at the sun directly, and when that happens we are blinded by such overwhelming radiance.

Our faculties are much too small to contain God, and so they become overwhelmed at his approach. Mother Teresa is another great example; she was a Holy woman who loved God despite her not feeling the presence of God throughout many of her years of service. There is a book about her dark night entitled *I loved Jesus in the night written by Fr. Paul Murray,* who was one of her spiritual directors.

Even though she did not feel God's presence, she saw Jesus in everyone she served. Despite her lack of God's presence, she still had a strong faith and recognized that God was ever by her side. Our faith is not built upon feeling, but upon Christ, who died for us so that we may live. Her great faith in Christ led her to continue serving and loving Him.

Every act of love she performed for others was an act of love for her brothers in whom she saw Christ present. Dear family, if you experience any moment of darkness or do not experience the presence of God, please do not get discouraged, but remember that God is still present despite his silence. As St. Paul said, "Christ lives in me." Christ lives in you!

Annual Mission Co-op Appeal July 23/24, 2016 Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary



Sisters representing the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary will be with us at OLM on the weekend of July 23 and 24. The religious community was founded in Ireland in 1924 to work with women in Nigeria, West Africa. The Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary are now an international community working in nine countries of Africa as well in Brazil They are a strictly missionary and Mexico. community with no institutions in the U.S.A. or Canada. All funds go directly to support their missionary work. The founder of the Missionary Sisters of the Holy Rosary, Bishop Joseph Shanahan, a Spiritan Priest from Tipperary, Ireland and Vicar Apostolic of Southern Nigeria, hoped to expand outreach to women in Nigeria. In February 1927, the first ten sisters made their profession as Holy Rosary Sisters. Five would continue to work on the mission of congregational growth and the formation of new members in Ireland; five would prepare to travel to Nigeria to initiate their mission. These five studied

the Igbo language and prepared to improve the livelihood of girls through a network of schools for teacher training, nursing, and technical instruction. They looked to Mary as a model for the



innate dignity of women. The Annual Mission Co-op Appeal provides support for the good works of the missions. Each year missionaries visit parishes of the Diocese of Providence to preach about their work and seek support. They look for spiritual support of the Catholics of Rhode Island through prayer and financial support with a special Second Collection. Thank you for your support.
