What is Purgatory?

Our sins have both eternal and temporal consequences. Through the Sacrament of Confession, the eternal consequences and the guilt of sin are remitted simultaneously. However, the temporal consequences remain,

requiring one to atone for sins committed. If we die, without having atoned for these sins, we require purification before — entering heaven. Such purification takes place in purgatory. Though not a physical location, purgatory is a place for those who have sinned to atone for what they have done wrong on earth. However, the only sins which are forgiven in purgatory are venial sins.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven." It also teaches that those not completely purged of sin and its consequences here on earth, may be purged after death.

Purgatory, the state of purification of love, for those who have not loved God and neighbor enough on earth, teaches us to love God completely in order to get to heaven, the perfect place of love. Before getting to heaven, we have to cleanse ourselves; make ourselves perfect.

From the Gospel of Matthew, we know purgatory exists: "and whoever says a word against the son of man will be forgiven; but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come" And "truly I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny."

We do know those in purgatory will eventually get us into heaven. However, the length of time a person is in purgatory depends on such things as how they lived on earth, God's mercy, and the prayers offered for them. Therefore, those in Purgatory truly need our prayers, so that, thus purified, they may attain the Beatific Vision of God. This is why the Church spends the whole month of November praying for all souls.

Some people think that when our loved ones pass away, we cannot do anything for them. We can still do good things for the dead by having Masses offered, offering personal prayers, almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of our deceased loved ones. St. John Chrysostom stated this clearly in a homily, "Why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them." Let us pray for all the souls in purgatory!
