Dear Parishioners:

Summer has arrived! Hopefully we can begin to enjoy some sunny, warm weather and less rain! School is out and the summer vacation for all school children has now begun.

The Fourth of July is coming soon! Don't let the summer go by without taking some time for rest, refreshment and relaxation. Pope Francis reminds us: "Moments of rest are sacred because in them we find God."

The summer brings with it family vacations and gatherings, respite from the routine and from work, and a chance to renew our lives. Summer reading is always part of the season for me. I hope to read a few good books this summer. For fun I hope to read a novel entitled *Conclave* by Robert Harris, a fictional story of intrigue at the Vatican!

For education I hope to read Archbishop Chaput's latest, Strangers in a Strange Land: Living the Catholic Faith in a Post-Christian World. It should provide some great insights into living a authentic Catholic life in the increasingly secular, and often hostile, world.

What is the Proper Way to Receive Holy Communion?

The external posture by which we receive Holy Communion shows our interior love for the mystery we celebrate. We must receive our Lord in Holy Communion with reverence, care, gentleness and humility. Attention to the

external signs of reverence shows our love of the Holy Eucharist. For in the Holy Eucharist, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present" (1374).

Before one receives Holy Communion, the Church asks that one make a bow of the head as a sign of reverence for what (or really whom) we are about to receive. In order to facilitate the smooth distribution of Holy Communion, each communicant should step right up to the priest, deacon or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. After hearing the words "The Body of Christ" the communicant should respond "Amen" indicating belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

In addition to the traditional posture of receiving Holy Communion on the tongue, the Holy See has granted permission for the faithful to receive Communion in the hand. Each mode has its own value and its own beauty. For some, receiving the Eucharist on their tongue is to signify their humility before the Lord and to recognize that it is God himself who feeds them. For others, touching the Eucharist makes them feel more connected to Jesus Christ himself. It takes humility to accept the Lord, present and visible, in one's own hand.

If receiving on the tongue, one should be sure to open his or her mouth wide enough that the host may easily be placed on the tongue. If one receives on the hand, the right hand should be placed directly under the left—like a throne ready to receive a king. The communicant should then *immediately* consume the host using the right hand. To pluck, grab on pull the Eucharist into their hands is a sign of great disrespect and could lead to accidentally dropping the sacred host.

It is very important that the Eucharist is not fumbled about where the particles of the sacred host could fall to the ground. Those who may be carrying something or assisting a small child, for example, should consider receiving on the tongue. The Catechism explains: "Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts."

In whatever manner one chooses to receive, the greatest attention should be given to the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist; the Church's greatest treasure.
