

We now await the arrival of young Fr. Barrow as our newly appointed Associate Pastor at OLM. We thank Bishop Tobin for sending us Fr. Barrow. Dear Billy: How did you know that you wanted to be a priest? I felt a calling to the Priesthood gradually. It began in High school as a simple nudge, and it slowly increased in college. The decision to enter seminary with the hopes of becoming a priest is a response to God's love for me.

The awareness of God's great Love for me awakened a desire to give myself wholeheartedly to Him by serving Him and His people. Before entering the seminary, I was a youth minister at St. Charles Borromeo Parish in Providence. As a youth minister, I witnessed the great thirst and need for God among the youth I served. This longing for God and his love and mercy were evident. Nonetheless, this desire and need for God is common to us all. We are thirsty for Him, and "Our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee, O God" as said St. Augustine. We are restless, longing to be satisfied, to have our desires fulfilled and to be content in perfect happiness. I believe that one's perfect happiness lies where one's heart rests. As our hearts will rest where the will of God lies. I remember when I entered the seminary, it took a deliberate decision to enter, which was similar to saying "Yes, Lord." This decision reminds me of the words of the Prophet Isaiah when the Lord asks, "Whom shall I send?" "Here I am," [Isaiah] said; "send me!" (Isaiah 6:8) With the simple act of entering the seminary, I was saying a lot more than a simple yes. I was saying "Here I am Lord, send me into your vineyard, I want to do your will!" This path of wanting to do the will of God for my life is my sincere desire. With this Yes I was also saying, "Lord may not my will but your will be done" and from this surrender, I experience both joy and peace. This gradual spiritual and interior journey led me to understand myself better and to have more clarity of the will of God for my life. Why Priesthood? I want to be a priest because I have a strong desire to serve others, and want to help them encounter the love of God that I have received. It is my desire to be a bridge to those seeking a closer relationship with Christ. It is my longing to be a spiritual Father to those seeking the love and mercy of God. I want to be an instrument in the hands of God, a bridge between God and his people. Ultimately, I want to share the truth, the Joy and the love that only comes from God through the ministering of the sacraments. I want to lay down my life in love for he who lay everything down for Love of you and me. Please be assured of my prayers for you.
