We had a joyful and faithful celebration of First Communion last Saturday morning. Sixty-four children from our parish received Jesus Christ sacramentally in Holy Communion for the very first time! It was a joyful celebration and we give thanks to God for such a wonderful occasion in the life of our parish family.

Our First Communion Class also celebrated the Annual May Crowning at the 10:30am Mass on Sunday. It was a fitting way to mark Mother's Day as we crowned our Blessed Mother Mary, Queen of the Angels and Queen of the May! The children consecrated themselves to the protection and patronage of Mary our Mother!

We congratulate these children and continue to pray for them as they grow in the faith. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, says: "You, who make your

#### What is Pentecost?

In Judaism, Pentecost was the second most important festival after Passover celebrating the giving of the Law on Sinai. It was originally a harvest festival in which the people brought the first fruits of the harvest to God, yet it became a celebration of covenant renewal and of the giving of the Law at Sinai.

With Christ, Pentecost marks the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Church. Poured out by the exalted Jesus at the right hand of God, the Holy Spirit is the new law descending on His Church. The disciples are gathered in the upper room when there is rush of mighty wind and tongues of fire and all were filled with the Spirit of God. This is certainly reminiscent of Ezekiel 37 where God resurrects the dead and ushers in the end times. The discussion of fire is also linked with God's judgment, especially in the preaching of John the Baptist. So it is very clear that the early Christians considered themselves to be the eschatological people of Israel living in the last age inaugurated by Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. The experience is centered on prophecy.

This is exactly what the book of Joel talks about: God pours out the spirit of prophecy. This links also with the celebration of the Gift of the Law on Prophecy, since it is not just the prediction of future, the bigger function is to say God's word here and now, thereby writing the Law on the person's heart. The Law was originally given in stone tablets but now written on the hearts of believers. For Luke, the Holy Spirit seals the New Covenant instituted by Christ, and it opens a new age: the mission of the Church to the Nations. Now God is speaking through the new Israel, the Church and the Apostles. This is symbolized by the gift of different tongues, whereby everyone understands what they say.

This gift of self by the third person of the Trinity continues the work of the life of Jesus, his founding of the Church, and the continuing guidance and sanctification of the Church. The Spirit procures the expansion of the Church. The gift of the Holy Spirit is normally connected to water baptism. The Holy Spirit, who guides the ministry of the apostles, builds up the Church by being the principle of personal sanctification of believers, by animating their actions through charity, and by inspiring their witness. Luke shows that the Holy Spirit is directly connected to Jesus: the Spirit animates the human action of Jesus, and the risen Jesus pours him out.



## Pentecost



n this day of Pentecost, we celebrate the full realization of Christ's work in the coming of the Holy Spirit who confers upon the Christian community strength and courage to live and proclaim the Gospel.

Easter, the church's first celebration of special note, dates back to the second century, and from early on was kept within the context of a fifty-day period called Pentecost. Pentecost as a separate celebration, however, was not established until the fourth century.

In the early church, those not quite ready for baptism at the Easter Vigil were baptized at the vigil of Pentecost.
