Hiep is to also help us with our Annual Vacation Bible School. This great week of fun and faith for our OLM children is scheduled for June 26—30. I hope you join us this Monday for May Devotions as Fr. Joseph Briody, a Priest of the Diocese of Raphoe, Ireland, is to lead our devotions in honor of Our Lady of Knock. He is a Professor of Scripture at St. John Seminary in Boston.

The Story of Knock began on the 21st August, 1879 when, at approximately 8 o'clock in the evening, fifteen people from the village of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland witnessed an Apparition of Our Lady, St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, a Lamb and a cross on an altar at the gable wall of the Parish Church.

These witnesses watched the Apparition in the pouring rain for two hours, reciting the Rosary. Although they themselves were saturated not a single drop of rain fell on the gable or the vision. There were fifteen official witnesses to the Apparition, most of whom were from the village of Knock and surrounding areas and ranged in age from just 5 years old to 74 years old.

There is a beautiful shrine at Knock where I have had the privilege to celebrate Mass and seek Our Lady's powerful intercession. Fr. Briody is to lead us in our devotions as we plead for the intercession of Our Lady of Knock for our parish. Please join us on Monday at 7:00PM for the Rosary, Adoration Eucharistic beautiful music.

What is the Easter Season?

When it comes to liturgical seasons, Lent often stands out in our minds as the unique period when our daily life changes, but there is also the unique period of fifty (longer than the forty days of Lent) days after Easter (which ends on Pentecost Sunday). We all know how to live the season of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is almost second nature to Catholics. After Easter Sunday, however, it may seem like we have returned to the status quo. Instead it is important to realize that we have fifty days to celebrate and reflect on the meaning of Easter. Part of living the Easter Season is realizing how profoundly shattering an experience the first Easter season was for those lived during it.

When those first disciples found the empty tomb trembling, fear, and astonishment came upon them. This is because what had happened was outside anything that could be expected. Their reaction stems from what happens when a creature encounters God. Throughout scripture "fear and trembling" signals the presence of the divine. For instance, Mary at the Annunciation says that she was "greatly troubled at the saying [of the angel]." The angel reassures her: "Do not be afraid." After this initial experience of the divine comes a soul-changing conversion of mind and heart.

What has changed? George Weigel points to five things. First, with the Resurrection we are now living in the "last days," which are unfolding in time and not at some point at the end of time (as some early Christians and even some Christians today think). Second, unlike the resurrection of Lazarus, Christ's resurrection is unique because Christ's body is transformed into a glorified body. Third, Christ is now sacramentally *present* to us particularly in the Eucharist in which we receive his resurrected body and blood. Fourth, the resurrection is a life-changing experiencing. We see this in the Apostles. They went from being afraid in the upper room to going out and spreading the Gospel (with the result that most would be martyred). Fifth, worship changes and Sunday is now the 8th day of the new creation because it is the day Christ rose. Benedict XVI writes, "Only an event that marked souls indelibly could bring about such a profound realignment of religious culture... [The] celebration of the Lord's day... is one of the most convincing proofs that something extraordinary happened that day."

This is part of what the Easter Season tries to capture: that majestic and shattering sense that something radical has happened; that life and existence have been fundamentally changed.
