Dear Parishioners:

We sang "Laudate omnes gentes, laudate Dominum" at the Confirmation Mass. It is taken from Psalm 117 and translates as: "All people sing praises to the Lord!"

We certainly sang praises to the Lord for this wonderful celebration of faith. We thank the young people who chose to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, their sponsors who bear witness to the living faith to them, and their families for their support and faith.

We must also thank Doug Green who directs our Confirmation Program at OLM and the many Religious Ed and OLM School teachers who have taught them over the years. The Confirmation Mass was truly a beautiful experience of faith and we thank Henri St. Louis and the OLM Choir for the music, the ushers for their service, and our sacristans who helped to prepare for the Mass.

And finally, we offer our thanks to Bishop Mark Spalding for traveling from his Diocese of Nashville, Tennessee to be with us for the Mass. President George Washington's Thanksgiving Day proclamation from 1789, includes these beautiful words:

"Now, therefore, I do recommend and assign THURSDAY, the TWENTY-SIXTH DAY of NOVEMBER next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be."

Thanksgiving Day is for giving thanks. It doesn't have to end when we offer grace over the turkey. Let's strive to remind ourselves of God's blessings, wherever we find them, however they come to us. And to give thanks for them, every day and in every moment.

What is the meaning of the word "Eucharist"?

Very shortly we will celebrate Thanksgiving Day and so this is an appropriate time to ask this question. "Eucharist" is actually a Greek word which means "to give thanks." As the Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us:

The inexhaustible richness of this sacrament is expressed in the different names we give it. Each name evokes certain aspects of it. It is called: Eucharist, because it is an action of thanksgiving to God. The Greek words eucharistein and eulogein recall the Jewish blessings that proclaim - especially during a meal - God's works: creation, redemption, and sanctification (CCC 1328).

In the Gospel of Luke we read: "Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me." The English portion, "said the blessing" can also be translated as "and giving thanks." The Greek word is the same: eucharistesas. The key here that the word means thanksgiving directed toward God, as opposed to thanksgiving directed elsewhere.

The word itself used to refer to the entire celebration of the Mass. The Didache is an early Christian text written in the first century. It is an important source because it details practices and beliefs of the early Christians. We find a reference to such a use in the Didache:

Celebrate the Eucharist as follows: Say over the cup: "we give you thanks, Father, for the holy vine of David, your servant, which you made known to us through Jesus your servant. To you be glory for ever."

Over the broken bread say: "We give you thanks, Father, for the life and the knowledge which you have revealed to us through Jesus your servant. To you be glory for ever" ... Do not let anyone eat or drink of your Eucharist except those who have been baptized in the name of the Lord.

One of the most important acts we can do in this life is to give thanks to God. The supreme and most exalted way to do this is in our participation and attendance at Mass. This Thanksgiving Day, let us unite ourselves to Christ's great act of thanks to his heavenly father.






