I am grateful for the OLM School PTG members who worked so hard to make the evening such a success. Also, I thank my brother priests, Fr. Gaffney, Fr. Young, Fr. Morris and Fr. I am very grateful to my friend, Bishop James Checchio of Metuchen, New Jersey, who is travelling up to RI to celebrate the OLM Confirmation Mass on November 5th Before becoming a bishop, Bishop Checchio served as the Rector of the North American College in Rome where both Fr. Pope Francis reminds us about Confirmation when he stated: "Confirmation unites us more firmly to Christ. It strengthens our relationship with the Church, and it gives us a special strength from the Holy Spirit to defend the faith and confess the name of Christ." Let us continue to pray that the Sacrament unites our young adults "more firmly to Christ" and may they always confess His sacred name in their lives!

This Friday from 5:30pm until 8:00pm the OLM School students are gathering in the

School Parking Lot for Annual Trunk or Treat Celebration. Fr. Barrow and I are decorating a vehicle once again for the event. Recently a new state law went into effect that mandates that an automated external defibrillator (AED) must be placed in public view at any public gathering space that can hold 300 or more people. We presently have an AED in our school building and one in the Church Sacristy. However, they are old and in need of updating.

We hope to replace them with more modern versions, and mount the new AEDS in a more public location, both in Church and in School. They are very expensive items that cost as much as \$1,500 a piece and we need four AEDs for our parish. If anyone would like to help us purchase these life saving devices, please contact me. Once the new AEDs are in place we plan to offer a training session in their use for our ushers, faculty and anyone else interested in learning how to use them.

How is the Exposed Eucharist in Adoration different from the Eucharist in the Tabernacle?

Eucharistic Adoration (which involves the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, hymns, incense and benediction) is one of the most important devotions in our spiritual lives. It offers us a chance to answer Jesus' question in the Garden: "Could you not keep watch for one hour?" (Mk. 14:37). Archbishop Fulton Sheen recommended a daily Holy Hour, ideally before the Blessed Sacrament. Pope Pius XII in "Mediator Dei" pointed out that the different forms of Eucharistic Adoration "have brought a wonderful increase in faith and the supernatural life to the Church."

Some would say that there is no difference between the Eucharist exposed and the Eucharist in the tabernacle. In both cases Jesus Christ is truly present, body, blood, soul and divinity. Aside from the other actions during Adoration listed above, the only difference seems to be that we can visually see the host. Yet, the act of looking at the host makes all the difference in the world because we are embodied beings. The act of religion is not simply interior, but involves the whole person, body and soul. The Incarnation demonstrates that God uses the world around us, even our very selves, as instruments to accomplish salvation. The sacraments themselves are visible, bodily signs which instrumentally cause invisible effects (particularly the transmission of grace). Even in our own contemporary lives we can appreciate the difference between seeing a person face to face and simply calling or even Skyping them.

When we see the host, which to our eyes appears as a small insignificant piece of bread, causes astonishment to realize that it is in fact the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ, God Himself. As the Eucharistic hymn, *Tantum Ergo* remarks: "Faith for all defects supplying, when the feeble senses fail." Looking at the host can trigger acts of faith and awe in the power and presence of God.

Furthermore, another important difference is that Eucharistic Adoration is a communal event with more formalized rites. In the end both practices, however, are important: adoring our Lord exposed in Adoration and adoring our Lord in the tabernacle. Pope St. John Paul II in his final encyclical "Ecclesia de Eucharistia" admirably summed up the doctrinal essentials: "The worship of the Eucharist outside of the Mass is of inestimable value for the life of the Church. This worship is strictly linked to the celebration of the Eucharistic Sacrifice... It is pleasant to spend time with him, to lie close to his breast like the Beloved Disciple (cf. Jn 13:25) and to feel the infinite love present in his heart. In the course of the day the faithful should not omit visiting the Blessed Sacrament... Such visits are a sign of gratitude, an expression of love and an acknowledgment of the Lord's presence."


