Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

It's hard to believe that October is coming to an end! So now we anticipate the month of November. It is a month in which we especially remember the dead, as it is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise."

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins."

The month of November begins with the great Solemnity of All Saints Day on Friday, November 1st. It is a holy day of obligation and we have four masses at OLM: 5:00pm Vigil, 7:30am, 9:00am School Mass and 7:00pm. On this great feast we celebrate all those who have attained heaven who we call saints both known and unknown,

Pope Francis suggests: "The Feast of All Saints, then, is not celebrated only in honor of those who have reached the goal and attained to heaven. It is also for the many simple and hidden people whom we may know, and who, through everyday holiness, help God to carry the world forward."

We also mark the solemn commemoration of the dead on All Souls Day, November 2nd.. In a very special way we remember all those who have died, and in particular we pray for the souls in Purgatory. We will have two All Souls Day Masses at OLM on Saturday, November 2nd, at 8:30am and 12:00pm. You are invited to join us for these solemn Masses.

Also, please know we honor all our beloved dead throughout month the of November. Your All Souls envelopes with the names of your own beloved deceased family and friends are Masses remembered in at November.

On Sunday, November 3rd we remember, in particular, all our fellow OLM parishioners who have died over the last year. Their grieving families are to join us at this special Mass of Remembrance.

As we pledge our prayers for our beloved dead, we are reminded of the words of Saint John Chrysostom in the 4th Century: "Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them." Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord; and let light perpetual shine upon them. May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

Pope *Emeritus* Benedict XVI teaches: "We commemorate all of the faithful departed, who have 'gone before us marked with the sign of faith and... who sleep in Christ' (Eucharistic Prayer I). It is very important that we Christians live a relationship of the truth of the faith with the deceased and that we view death and the afterlife in the light of Revelation."

The Our Faith, Our Future Parish Capital Campaign has begun with a great and enthusiastic response. Many parishioners have attended our campaign receptions to learn more about this vital effort for our parish and diocese. I thank the many volunteers who have been helping and also the many parishioners who have pledged such generous gifts thus far.

There are more campaign receptions scheduled this week. I urge everyone to attend and learn more about the campaign. We've inherited a great legacy of and sacrifice in this faith wonderful parish of Our Lady of Mercy. The witness of those who came before us calls us today to continue in the same spirit of sacrifice and faith. If God knows everything, then are we really free?

Given a choice between two options, God already knows which of the two we will choose. If God already knows what we will do before we do it, then we must do that action. If we must do the action, then we are not really free. Therefore, we are not really free.

This ancient argument tries to fit together human freedom and divine foreknowledge. Some strategies have compromised either human freedom or divine foreknowledge. For instance, to preserve the fact that God knows all things, past, present, future and possible, some deny that humans possess freedom (e.g. Fatalists and Calvinists). Others, to preserve human freedom, deny that God knows all things, particularly future events (e.g. Process Theology). We can, however, harmonize the two without denying human freedom or divine foreknowledge.

We need to keep in mind that God exists outside of time. For God all things, all people, all atoms, all times, all events, etc. are present to Him in the one eternal Now. There is no past, present or future for God. Furthermore, knowledge of an action, does not necessitate that action. I may have some secret insight that you are going to the store tomorrow, but my knowledge of your choice, does not necessitate your going. In this answer knowing a choice, does not necessitate that choice.

A possible counterargument goes as follows: While human knowledge does not necessitate action, divine knowledge does, because God knows things infallibly, and hence that action must necessarily occur. While I may know that you have chosen to go to the bookstore tomorrow morning, my human knowledge does not necessitate you going. Anything known by God, meanwhile, must necessarily happen, because he possesses infallible knowledge.

To answer this counterargument we return to the distinction between God and time. Because God knows choices outside of time, he knows them as necessary events, but those events are still contingent (i.e. non-necessary) events within time. In other words, we know our past choices as necessary choices, insofar as they can no longer be changed (the past is the past), yet looking back to them we can see that they were free choices. The fact that they cannot be changed now, does not mean that they could not be changed . Likewise, God being outside of time infallibly knows all choices, but inside of time they are still future non-necessary/ contingent choices on our part. St. Thomas Aquinas writes: "Hence it is manifest that contingent things are infallibly known by God, inasmuch as they are subject to the divine sight in their presentatlity; yet they are future contingent [choices] in relation to [our choice as the cause]."







All Saints




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L he solemnity of All Saints began in the Eastern church in the fourth century as a feast of all the martyrs and was celebrated on an unknown day around the time of Easter or Pentecost.

In the year 610, the Western church adopted and expanded the feast to include nonmartyrs and the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrating it on May 13, the date on which the Pantheon, the former temple of all the Roman gods, was dedicated anew as a Christian church.

Sometime between 731 and 741, Pope Gregory III dedicated a chapel in the Vatican Basilica to all the saints and declared the first day of November to be their official feast day.

This day celebrates not only those men and women who have been canonized but all who have lived according to the will of God and died in his grace.
