Can a Catholic get a Tattoo?

Here is the short answer: the Church is not against tattoos per se (in and of themselves). There is nothing intrinsically wrong with a tattoo. A tattoo is simply a permanent coloring of the skin, much like using make-up or crayons on one's skin. In Ancient Rome the soldiers were marked with the seal of the emperor. St. Paul speaks of being marked for Christ. Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Orders create a permanent mark on our persons. Finally, in some cultures tattoos are considered part of the identity of that culture (allowable insofar as they do not encourage idolatry).

Here is an important distinction in salvation history: ceremonial precepts vs. moral precepts vs. juridical precepts: The new covenant established by Jesus Christ retained the moral precepts of the Old Law, but not the ceremonial or juridical. The ceremonial and juridical precepts were instituted by God as a gradual way to form a people of his own that would await the coming of the Messiah. Now that the Messiah is here, they are not needed, albeit they are important to know. They were instituted to keep the people from falling into idolatry and other forms of pagan worship. Hence passages such as Leviticus 19:28: "Do not... put tattoo marks on yourselves. I am the Lord," is a ceremonial precept and is therefore not necessarily binding. The Ten Commandments are moral precepts and hence are still binding.

When it comes to deciding to have a tattoo we need to consider the particular instance. We are trying to avoid any type of self-mutilation, idolatry and at the same time encourage modesty. Further, what is the image in question, is it being done as a sign of vanity, would this person get this because they question their own intrinsic beauty, is the image vulgar, profane or demonic, is it worth risking disease and infection, is it good to get something permanent, how much of the body will the tattoo cover, and so on? One person had a particularly good way of looking at: would you put a bumper sticker on a Ferrari?

As I said intrinsically there is nothing wrong with putting a mark on your body, just as there is nothing wrong with having your ears pierced; it is the subsequent and auxiliary concerns (motivation for the action, extent, and content) where the real moral issue arises. The motivation for getting a tattoo can easily degrade into vanity and idolatry.

Still, even though it is not prohibited we need to ask: would getting a tattoo constitute a movement in my spiritual life toward God? If the answer is no, then why are you doing it?


ABOUT THE SECOND COLLECTION
