Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

Last weekend Senator John McCain of Arizona died and is to be laid to rest this weekend. He was an American Hero who exhibited great faith and courage throughout his life. As a young Navy Pilot he endured incredible suffering and torture while held as a prisoner of war during the Vietnam War.

Yet he overcame this adversity and survived. He went on to serve our nation as a distinguished Member of Congress and U.S. Senator. Let us pray for the gentle repose of his noble soul, may he rest in peace.

Senator McCain, a true profile in courage, once said: "Courage is not the absence of fear, but the capacity to act despite our fears." His words offer us inspiration as we continue to face the problems in our Church. Fear can easily overcome us and lead us into We face despair. many challenges in our Church, in our world and in our lives, let us do so with faith, hope and courage,

In Character Is Destiny, one of the many books he authored, Senator McCain wrote of the stories he learned from his parents and at school. The book is a compilation of stories of heroes, both famous and obscure, whose values exemplify character and courage.

Included in the book are profiles of courage many including Sir Winston Churchill, who offered simple and sage give up!". advice: "never McCain includes the story of Mary Clarke, who left her life as a Beverly Hills socialite to work in the desperate conditions of a Mexican iail. George

Washington is lauded by McCain for his wisdom and ability to adapt in the face of battle.

Although not a Catholic himself. Senator McCain writes about several Catholic Saints including Saint Maximillian Kolbe, a Catholic priest in Auschwitz who offered to take a condemned man's place. St. Catholic Thomas More. a layman who took on a king and died a martyr for the faith, is also featured. And, so is St. Joan of Arc, a young girl who exhibited great faith and courage and became the Patroness of France.

It is people of character, faith and courage such as these, as well as Senator McCain himself, who came to my mind this week. If ever there is a time when our Church and our world cries out for men, women and children, as well as religious sisters, priests, deacons and bishops of character, courage and faith it is in this moment in our history. St. Thomas More reminds us: "You wouldn't abandon ship in a storm just because you couldn't control the winds."

This past Wednesday was the first day at OLM School. The first day of school is always a day of joy and hope as students return, and others arrive for the very first time. It was great to welcome them all to OLM School! Our parish school declares its mission to teach our students to strive to be saints and scholars. Why are we called Roman Catholics? Is there another kind of Catholic?

There are indeed other Catholics out there, or at least other churches which belong to the Catholic Church. First things first: When we speak of the Catholic Church (notice capital "C" for the word Church) we mean: One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. These are the four marks of the Church as defined by the Council of Constantinople in AD381. If a church possesses these four marks then it is part of the Church which Christ founded and it is properly called the Catholic Church. These are the marks of the Church precisely because they are the marks of Christ. He is one, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic. The Church manifests the very qualities of Christ Himself and is united to Him as his bride. See the Catechism of the Catholic Church 868 for more information.

We use the term "Roman Catholic" to distinguish the liturgical and legal rite of the individual church. Other churches will still have valid sacraments, priesthood, etc., but their masses and laws will be slightly different from each other. So what are the other churches which are part of the one Catholic Church? Albanian, Armenian, Romanian, Maronite, Syriac, Ruthenian, and so on. The list goes on. Each of these churches have the four marks of the Church. To be really precise, in relation to these other churches we would not call ourselves Roman Catholics; we would call ourselves Latin Rite Catholics or simply Catholics. All of us are members of the Catholic Church, but belong to particular rites within the one and same Church.

In fact, "Roman Catholic Church" is not the proper name for the Church. The Anglicans promoted it because of a flawed theology known as "branch theory". Anglicans think of themselves as another legitimate "branch" of the Church founded by Christ represented as the trunk. The other branches are the Orthodox Church and (what they call) the Roman Catholic Church. Unfortunately, the Anglicans are not even properly speaking a church. They (along with the Lutherans, Presbyterians, etc.) are "ecclesial communions" precisely because they are deficient in one or more of the four marks of the church (mostly in regard to "apostolic" which points to apostolic succession of bishops and handing on scripture, tradition and sacraments).

One of the consequences of this theology is that the Church is not something merely intangible or spiritual (as the Protestants hold). Rather we can point to one, enduring, true, and visible society on earth which is the Church. We can point to the coherent and stable transmission of scripture and tradition. We can point most especially to the enduring celebration and transmission of the sacraments. Hence historically speaking, we can find the same Catholic Church present right from the beginning and across the centuries (and will be until the second coming of Christ).






