Dear Parishioners:

As he announced at Masses last weekend, Bishop Tobin recently informed Father that he is to be Connors transferred from OLM Church effective July 1, 2016. It is truly a great honor for Fr. Connors to be recognized for his great intellectual gifts and his tremendous priestly zeal. It is a further testament to the trust and confidence of both His Excellency Bishop Tobin and His Eminence Sean Cardinal O'Malley of Boston to entrust the training, education and formation of many of the future priests of New England to Fr. Connors.

While I am greatly pleased for Father and most happy for this important appointment, it is truly a bitter-sweet moment. I am truly sadden at his departure from OLM as Fr. Connors continues to be a trusted and valued associate whose warm friendship, priestly fraternity and wise consul I shall surely miss. I know many of you will as well.

Father Connors has graciously accepted my invitation to keep rooms here at the OLM Rectory during his time of study abroad. He is to be a regular visitor to us when home from Rome. We will formally thank among us in June.

The assignment of a new associate pastor to OLM remains uncertain at this time. There is a growing shortage of priests in our Diocese and the availability of priests is always uncertain. have written to Bishop Tobin asking that a new Associate Pastor be assigned to OLM. However, there is no guarantee that a priest is available to be assigned to our parish.

In the meantime. Connors is here at OLM and continues his zealous good work! Kindly keep Fr. Connors and his dear parents, Joe and Lisa in your prayers during these months of transition. We wish Fr. Connors sincere congratulations. Ad multos gloriosque anos!

Dear Fr. Connors: Why don't Catholics eat meat on Fridays in Lent?

The short answer is because Catholics believe in penance.

While this is not widely understood today, Catholics believe freely chosen sacrifices offered to Christ have value for our sanctification.

The universal law of the Church requires abstinence from meat on all Fridays throughout the year. In 1966 the bishops of the United States were granted permission for Catholics in the United States to substitute some other act of piety or charity for abstinence from meat on non-Lenten Fridays. That is to say, every Friday throughout the year remains a day of penance. Catholics should do something on Fridays—extra prayers or small sacrifices—to recall our Lord's death on the Cross.

In Lent, however, the traditional obligation of abstinence was retained even in the United States. Abstinence from meat is an ancient and common form of self-denial and sacrifice. For many centuries this has been the common, identifiable, form of mortification.

While an extravagant fish dinner would not violate the letter of law, the Catholic faithful have always understood that the idea is for the meal to be sacrificial. The beneficial thing about Friday abstinence from meat is that it is identifiable and communal. All Catholics together make this common sacrifice.

Fasting and acts of self-denial like abstinence aid our prayer by freeing the mind for contemplation. They satisfy for sins as they are acts of penance properly so-called. They also lead to growth in virtue by increasing self-restraint.

The real question is: do we value self-denial? Do we understand the importance of fasting and penance as our Lord spoke of them in the Gospel? He was always pointing us to the deepest meaning of these practices, that is, union with Him and growth in charity. In so doing it benefits others too.



With the season of Lent beginning on February 10, please take a moment to review the following Lenten Regulations.

Abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent (for those 14 and older) is required by Church law. Also, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are fast days: those between the ages of 18 and 59 should eat less, meaning, take no solid food between meals and only one full meal that day. Serious reasons such as one's health can excuse a person from these rules. Pastors and parents are encouraged by the law of the Church to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

Following the implementation of the revised Code of Canon Law on November 27th, 1983, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops in the United States determined that the rules of fast and abstinence which have existed for the last several years in this country be maintained; namely, that the faithful must observe suitable penitential practices on all Fridays throughout the year. These penitential practices need not include abstaining from meat. However, as indicated above, the faithful must not eat meat on all the Fridays of Lent as well as on Ash Wednesday. They must also observe faithfully the fast regulations as they have been stated above in accord with the universal law of the Church. (Cf. Code of Canon Law, Canons 1250-1252.)

## 1st Sunday of Lent



As we celebrate this first Sunday of our penitential season, it is interesting to note that the word "Lent" comes from the Old English *lencten* or *lengten*, which means springtime and derives from the concept of lengthening daylight.

By the fourth century, Lent had come to be a period of intense final preparation for catechumens who would be baptized at Easter and a period of re-conversion for penitents, serious sinners who were seeking reconciliation.

As conversion and re-conversion took place within the community of the faithful, Lent was soon seen as an excellent opportunity for all to fast, pray, and engage in charitable works in preparation for baptismal renewal at Easter.


