Dear Parishioners:

Recently Bishop Tobin wrote a letter asking all people to take up prayers during this month for persecuted Christians. wrote: "I invite all members of the Church to undertake some personal acts of prayer, sacrifice or charity for our suffering brothers and sisters. Perhaps you dedicate the Lenten could practices you have already begun to this specific intention. Perhaps you could undertake additional prayer, sacrifice or good works for this intention."

In this letter he reminds us of the plight of persecuted Christians in Iraq, Syria, Egypt, Libya, Nigeria and North Korea. In these places, and others. Christians have seen their churches and schools attacked and even destroyed. There are reports of personal attacks upon Christians who have been kidnapped, raped, tortured. crucified and beheaded. Dear Fr. Connors: What do Catholics believe about evolution?

St. John Paul II explained: "In his encyclical *Humani generis* (1950), my predecessor Pius XII has already

affirmed that there is no conflict between evolution and the doctrine of the faith regarding man and his vocation, provided that we do not lose sight of certain fixed points." That is to say, so long as one understands the findings of science and of Scripture correctly there is no conflict between faith and reason.

The first chapters of the Book of Genesis do not provide a newspaper-like account of the origins of man. They explain real historical events—the creation and fall of man—but often use figurative language (CCC 390). A detailed account of the biological origins of man are not provided in Sacred Scripture. For that reason, nothing molecular biology can discover can contradict revealed truth.

Microevolution—small changes over time within a species—is an observable reality and certainly does not contradict any truth of faith. Macroevolution from one species to another is a more complicated phenomenon about which there exists a variety of theories—from classical Darwinism to the theory of punctuated equilibrium. Each provides quite a distinct account of evolutionary change.

The "certain fixed points" about which John Paul II speaks would include: the uniqueness of man and his vocation; the rational, immortal human soul is not subject to evolution; the soul is infused by God at a particular point in time and thus there was a first human being. Any theory which would make God unnecessary or superfluous also contradicts right reason and the truths of faith.

The idea of Catholics blind to the truth of science is absurd. Equally absurd are philosophical extrapolations about the meaning of the universe or the place of man in creation which, while posited as science, are really theological claims without merit. The truth is it is often evolutionary biologists who overstep their bounds into philosophy. Faith and reason never contradict one another so long as one understands the kind of question one is asking.




RE Classes for all grades this Sunday, March 15th.


