Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

As you know, Fr Healey is in Rome this week for a series of meetings related to his work as Director of the Rhode Island Catholic Conference. Along with representatives of other American dioceses he will meet with officials in the Roman Curia who assist the Holy Father in his governance of the Church. The important work of the state Catholic Conferences throughout the country aids the Church in Her proclamation of the Gospel in the public square.

Related to his work in this area, I am very happy to inform you that the Rhode Island Right to Life Committee will honor Fr Healey at the 2013 Proudly Pro-Life Awards Banquet. The banquet will be held Tuesday, November 19, 2013 with a reception at 6:00pm and dinner at 7:00pm at the West Valley Inn in West Warwick Tickets banquet are \$100 and can be purchased by contacting Barth Bracy at RI Right to Life 401-277-0591 or www.rirtl.org.

RI Right to Life is the largest pro-life organization in Rhode Island and an affiliate of the National Right to Life Committee. They will honor Fr. Healey for his many years of work in defense of human life, especially in his role as editorial writer for the *Rhode Island Catholic*, the newspaper of the Diocese of Providence. Fr. Healey recently concluded his nearly 15 years of service in that position.

In addition, in his work as Director of the Rhode Island Catholic Conference and chief lobbyist for the Diocese at the General Assembly Fr Healey has been a strong and consistent advocate for the unborn, the disabled, the aged and infirm. It would be wonderful if there was a strong showing of support at the awards banquet from Our Lady of Mercy. The good work of RI Right to Life relies on your support.

Pope Francis recently reminded us: "Every child who is condemned unjustly to being aborted bears the face of Jesus Christ." The Pope went on to say, "that is why concern for human life in its totality has become in recent years a real priority for the Church's Magisterium."

The protection of innocent human life is indeed a priority. We should be proud of the fact that the Church stands up in defense of the innocent and voiceless. We should never grow weary in our defense of the unborn. We seek a society where the strong protect the weak and that every child, in every place, at every stage, is recognized to have a dignity—and in Christ— a destiny beyond imagining.

As you know, to create and sustain a culture that values life we need to support families. The only firm foundation for a culture of life is when we understand and live the truth that love-making and life-making go together. As the Pope keeps telling us, these unchangeable teachings are not primarily a "No" to anybody but a great "Yes" to life and love.

This coming Friday, November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation. The Church requires every Catholic to attend Mass on this day. Masses will be held at 5:00pm on October 31, and 7:30am, 9:00am and 7:00pm on November 1. This is a great feast which reminds us of the great family of the Church which continues in Heaven. The Saints are models of holiness and intercessors for us in Heaven.

This Saturday, November 2 marks the feast of All Souls. We will have an additional Mass at 12:00pm on that day in which will remember in a particular way all those who have died this year.

Also, be reminded that this coming weekend the Saturday evening Mass will move to 4:00pm.

Since I don't often write in this space, let me conclude by saying how blessed these first months have been at Our Lady of Mercy. Your warm welcome has been most generous. They tell us in the seminary that we should love the people we serve. Well, I do. Might our work together of building up the Kingdom of God by relying ever more on friendship with Christ found in the Church continue to bear fruit.

The Catechism Corner

In the Autumn of each year, we look around us and see death and dying. The trees appear in their greatest glory yet we know that it is a sign

that they will soon be "leaf-less" and dormant for the cold winter months. We also know that many people will die as the months become colder and the



weather takes its toll on their YEAR OF FAITH 2013 health. Death, though, in the end, should not be something that scares the Christian believer. Death should not in any way cause us to be afraid. Christ assures us that He is on the other side of death waiting for us. Each one of us then, regardless of our age or health, should daily keep the moment of our own death before us--not as a morbid or depressing reminder but rather as a realistic view of our earthly life. Being mindful of how we will all eventually end our lives, guides us in the living of our lives. "Death is the end of man's earthly pilgrimage, of the time of grace and mercy which God offers him so as to work out his earthly life in keeping with the divine plan, and to decide his ultimate destiny." Death for the faithful believer brings that ultimate closeness to the Lord for which every man is made. The moment of our death will be no different than any other moment. If we constantly choose the Lord in our life, then we will also choose Him in our death. The spiritual classic, The Imitation of Christ, makes this point more than obvious: "Every action of yours, every thought, should be those of one who expects to die before the day is out. Death would have no terrors for you if you had a quiet conscience...Then why not keep clear of sin instead of running away from death? If you aren't fit to face death today, it's very unlikely you will be tomorrow." Before even thinking of tomorrow first, check it out in the Catechism of the Catholic Church #1013.






