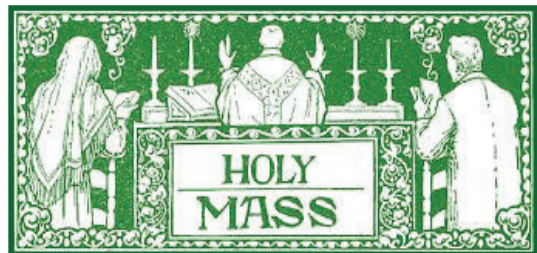

Dear Parishioners:

October is a time to pray the Rosary and also Respect Life Month. Despite the recent U.S. Supreme Court Dobbs Decision on Abortion, nothing has changed in Rhode Island. In 2019 the R.I. General Assembly codified Roe v. Wade in R.I. law, and now Abortion in our state is allowed until the birth of the preborn child. Pray a Rosary for life!

From the political ads I've seen on T.V. and political mailers in my mailbox, Abortion seems to be the major issue for many candidates for public office. Sadly many of these candidates are Catholic and fully support extreme Abortion.

One of the proposals of the pro-abortion movement is the public funding of Abortion on demand with federal and state tax dollars. Governor McKee and several candidates proudly accepted the endorsement of the abortionists from Planned Parenthood last week.

Following Planned Parenthood's wishes, the Governor has now included medical insurance coverage for abortion-related services for state workers and those on Medicaid in his proposed state budget. Every taxpayer in Rhode Island, including those opposed to Abortion, will now be forced to pay for the destruction of preborn babies up until birth!

The Governor has suggested that the public funding of the destruction of innocent unborn children through Abortion produces savings in the state budget. Such was the finding of the R.I. State Budget Office analysis commissioned by the Governor last March. It

suggests that *"Rhode Island could save \$5.4 million a year in taxpayer dollars if it removed the current legal barrier to abortion coverage for state workers and others who depend upon the state for the health insurance plans."*

Yet the reality is that for women who live in poverty, Abortion is a desperate act, not an act of choice. Advocating for destroying human life to save funds in the state budget is a cold and calculating policy that seems to imitate the coercive abortion policies of China and North Korea. It is truly devoid of any sense of decency and morality and must be rejected.

Governor McKee should offer a choice and alternative to enable the expectant mother and their unborn child to live and prosper. Elected officials should seek to pass laws and enact policies that treat expectant mothers and their unborn children with respect and dignity due to all human beings, not as an economic burden to be disposed of simply because they live in poverty.

The Catholic Church firmly believes in the dignity of human life from conception to natural death, including that of all unborn children. This Governor's budget proposal would be a step in the wrong direction for protecting unborn children and their mothers from the violence of Abortion.

Pope Francis states: *"Abortion is not the lesser of two evils. It is a crime. It is to throw someone out to save another. That's what the Mafia does. It is a crime, an absolute evil."*

Pray that, as a Catholic, our Governor might listen to the

Holy Father's wise words and reconsider his proposal. May St Thomas More, the patron of politicians, intercede for the Governor and all elected public officials and those who seek public office and lead them to embrace the truth about the sanctity of human life!

Next Sunday, fifty-five of our young Our Lady of Mercy parishioners are to be Confirmed in their Catholic Faith. Bishop William Byrne of Springfield, Massachusetts, will celebrate the Confirmation Mass next Sunday at 5:00 pm. Please pray for our Confirmation Class as they make the final preparation to receive the Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Confirmation Class will join us on Monday for October Devotions. We invite you to join them on Monday at 7:00 pm and pray for them before our Eucharistic Lord. We pray for them as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation and for the Holy Spirit to enter their lives. We pray as St. Catherine of Siena said: *"Be who God meant you to be, and you will set the world on fire."*

We thank you for supporting Hurricane Ian Relief in this weekend's Second Collection. Catholic Charities is now on the ground, assisting those affected and in need of food, water, shelter, and clothing. Pray for them. Also, please pray for our Confirmation Class. Be well. Stay safe. Pope Saint John Paul II – October 22

On October 22, the Church celebrates Pope St. John Paul II, possibly the most influential Catholic Churchman in the last 100 years. Born on May 18, 1920, Karol Józef Wojtyła, in Wadowice, Poland, would grow up to become a man of many gifts and talents. A great athlete, student, and theatrical performer, his life was shaped by the Church and his father, especially after losing his mother at a young age. Elected Pope on October 16, 1978, he encouraged the world in his Inaugural Address, “Do not be afraid! Open wide the doors for Christ,” and would continue this message for his nearly 27-year-long pontificate. For all those years, he would tirelessly guard the deposit of faith and the tradition of the Church. It is impossible to sum up the great work of the St. John Paul II in a short paragraph. However, his love for the Church, our Blessed Mother, humanity, and his homeland of Poland was always prominent. His favorite food was a cream-filled cake known as Kremowka. I do not dare even to try to create this cake so beloved by Pope Saint John Paul II that it is now known as “Papal Cream Cake”. Instead, something a little heartier that the future Pontiff enjoyed as a child, “Bigos” or Polish Hunters Stew, perfect for a fall evening.

Bigos

Ingredients: 2lb pounds pork shoulder, 1 green cabbage chopped, 1 oz. dried mushrooms, 1tbs black peppercorns, 25oz jar fresh sauerkraut, 1 ½ lbs. fresh mushrooms, 2 tbs vegetable oil, 1 large onion chopped, 2 tbs tomato paste, 1 smoked ham hock, 1 lb. Polish sausage, 1 tbs caraway seeds, 2 tbs dried marjoram, 2 tbs horseradish. 12 oz lager beer, salt.

Instructions: 1. Pour hot water over dried mushrooms and soak for half hour. Roughly grind black peppercorns, Cube pork shoulder into 2 inch cubes, same with sausage. Drain sauerkraut. 2. In large pot with lid heat the oil on medium-high and brown pork shoulder then remove it and set aside. 3. Put the onion and fresh cabbage in the pot and cook until soft, then sprinkle with salt and add tomato paste and cook out. 4. Add the fresh mushrooms and cook about 10 minutes. 5. Add everything but the horseradish into the pot and top with beer. Stir to combine. Not everything should be covered. 6. Bring to a simmer and cook for a minimum of two hours. 7. Discard any fat on surface and shred the ham hock and cook for another half an hour. 8. Stir in horseradish and serve!

St. John de Brébeuf

AMONG THE first martyrs in North America were John de Brébeuf (+1649), Isaac Jogues (+1646), and their companions. These Jesuits from France spent time as missionaries along what is now the border of the United States and Canada. Eager to preach the Gospel to people who had never heard it, they came among the natives of the new world, labored hard, and suffered much.

John de Brébeuf grew up in Normandy, and joined the Jesuits at the age of twenty-four. Some years after he was ordained a priest, he worked among various native groups in North America, especially the Hurons. The number of his converts seems small by comparison with those recorded by missionaries in other parts of the world, but the difficulty of the language kept him from delivering effective catechesis at first. Isaac Jogues worked primarily among the Mohawks. Together with some colleagues, they suffered horrific tortures and martyrdom.

In the liturgical calendar, the days for saints are often assigned to the day of their death. These martyrs died on different dates; for example, John de Brébeuf on March 16, and Isaac Jogues on October 18. The first of these falls during Lent each year; the second is already the Feast of St. Luke the evangelist. So, Catholics in the United States celebrate these martyrs with a memorial on the next available date, October 19. Saint Paul of the Cross already occupied that date as an optional memorial. Rather than eliminate his observance, the calendar has transferred it to October 20—only in the United States.

The Collect for the October 19 martyrs notes their “toil” for the gospel and “the shedding of their blood.” It prays that “the faith of Christians may be strengthened day by day.” Blessed are those whose faith is more important than life itself.
