

Dear Parishioners:

We thank the many OLM parishioners and friends of OLM School. They were so generous in supporting the See You in September Raffle. We sold all 600 tickets and raised \$50,000 to help our school continue its vital mission. The winners of the raffle appear in this week's bulletin. We congratulate them. But the real winners are the young saints and scholars of our outstanding parish school who benefit from your generosity.

Of course, the raffle wasn't the only way we marked our parish feast last week. On Monday, we had Mercy Devotions with an outstanding homily Mercy from on Dominican Friar, Fr. Patrick Mary Briscoe, OP from the PC Priory. We also had a solemn and joyful Feast Day Mass celebrated by Bishop Evans on Thursday. It was a great week honoring our parish patroness seeking her powerful and intercession.

We continue seeking the powerful intercession of our Mother Mary throughout October. Each Monday night this month, at 7:00 pm, we gather for Eucharistic Adoration and the Rosary. A great way to seek the Mother of Mercy's help and guidance as we meditate on the mysteries of our Lord. "The Rosary is the 'weapon' for these times," said St. Padre Pio.

These many years later, his words remain true. The Rosary is the weapon of our times, for we live in a time of turbulent conflict, confusion, and crisis in our world. We are still suffering from the COVID 19 Pandemic and its tragic results for so many.

If you cannot make Monday Devotions, please be sure to pick up your Rosary and pray at home, in the car, or even at work. Make time in your busy day to pray with the beads resting on your night table, tucked away in a drawer, hanging on your car mirror, or hidden in your pocket. Turn to our Blessed Mother and ask her help and seek her intercession.

St. Padre Pio explains: "Some people are so foolish that they think they can go through life without the help of the Blessed Mother. Love the Madonna and pray the Rosary, for her Rosary is the weapon

against the evils of the world today. All graces given by God pass through the Blessed Mother."

This weekend we happily resume the 9:00 am Sunday Mass and Saturday Confessions at 4:00 pm. Thank you for your patience and understanding. Also, I ask that you continue your kind cooperation with the COVID 19 guidelines: Please wear a mask, keep a social distance, and wash your hands frequently. What is the relation between the Catholic Church and Politics?

President George Washington once said, "Freedom prospers when religion is vibrant and the rule of law under God is acknowledged." Washington, the other founding fathers, and the states themselves saw the value of religion in the public domain, but today the metaphor "Separation of Church and State" has come to mean the prohibition of public displays of faith (the removal of crucifixes and Biblical quotations) and the prohibition of religion in political discourse. Interestingly it is a phrase not found in the Constitution, but is shorthand to refer to the First Amendment: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." Since 1947 there have been three contemporary interpretations of "Separation of Church and State:" strict separationism, non-preferentialism, and the jurisdictional/federalismenhancing view.

Strict separationism prohibits the government from any religious influence or exercise (the government is to be irreligious). Non-preferentialism believes that the national government will not establish an official church of the U.S. and it will not favor one religion over another. This does not exclude government support for or influence from a particular religion. Nor does it prohibit the government from supporting piety, religiosity, and religiously grounded morality. The jurisdictional-enhancing view argues for no official church and offers protection to each state to maintain religious establishments and policies within its borders. Only one interpretation prohibits the influence of religion in politics and that is the first, which, not surprisingly, has been invoked to silence religious influence in politics.

Fr. Healey regularly lobbies at the RI General Assembly on issues of poverty, the common good, sanctity of life, and respect for human dignity. In state capitals throughout the U.S. the Catholic Church is advocating for such policies. All of us need to become more active in our local politics to make our voice heard. Those who advocate for human life and dignity, peace and justice, and religious freedom reflect biblical values which are the cornerstone of Western Civilization; and of the United States. Those oppose religion in the public square are hacking away at the very foundation upon which they stand. If anyone says to you: "your opinion is invalid because you are a Catholic and religion cannot be involved in public policies," then they are following only one interpretation of the Constitution. We can appeal to the founding fathers and to the Constitution to support us in our efforts as Catholic Citizens.






