

Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed the Dr. Martin Luther King Holiday Act, proclaiming the third Monday in January as Martin Luther King Jr. Day. The next year, he declared the third Sunday in January as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. The two are still connected today.

On Monday, we celebrate Dr. Martin Luther King Day and reflect upon his life and work. His efforts in fighting for racial justice and equality made significant progress in erasing the stain of racism and injustice against African Americans.

However, we know we still have work to do in ending the sin of racism. Continuing social unrest, growing tensions, and senseless violence in our communities remind us that we must continue to build the culture of love, respect, and peace to which the Gospel calls us.

The Church's teaching about the sin of racism is grounded in scriptural the understanding of all people's equal dignity, created in God's image and Christ's redemption of all. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us: "Every form of social or cultural discrimination in fundamental personal rights on the grounds of race. color. social sex. conditions, language, or religion must be curbed and eradicated as incompatible with God's design."

In accepting the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize, Dr. King stated, "Civilization and violence are antithetical concepts." So while we celebrate his legacy and work against racial injustice,

we must also reflect on the work that still needs to continue to establish a civilization of love.

Too often we have witnessed people turning to violence to voice their protest. The senseless violence and mayhem we've seen do nothing to advance the cause of justice or serve the common good. Sadly attacks on human life are all too common and acceptable in our nation.

Our Catholic Faith teaches that the injustice and harm racism causes are an attack on human life. The Church has spoken out consistently and vigorously against abortion, assisted suicide, euthanasia, the death penalty, and other forms of violence that threaten human life. In the U.S. Bishop's Pastoral Letter on Racism, they state:

"It is not a secret that these attacks on human life have severely affected people of color, who are disproportionately affected by poverty, targeted for abortion, have less access to healthcare, have the greatest numbers on death row, and are most likely to feel pressure to end their lives when facing serious illness. As bishops, we unequivocally state that racism is a life issue."

We mark a sad legacy of violence against women and children this week. Forty-eight years ago, this Friday, the Supreme Court legalized abortion in the United States. Friday is also a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.

If we are to rid our society of the moral evil of racism and the violence of abortion, we must first begin with prayer. I invite you to join

us on Friday as we mark this tragic anniversary with all-day prayer and adoration for the legal protection of the unborn.

Just as we must continue to pray and work together to overcome the evil of racism, we must be more committed to promoting more profound respect for human life and dignity, especially for the unborn and the most vulnerable.

We hear many politicians other leaders rightly and condemning the violence all too present in our country. Sadly many of them have failed ever to condemn the violence abortion. As Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta stated: "Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love but to use violence to get what they want. That is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion."

On Monday, we celebrate Dr. King's life and legacy with its significant contribution to our nation for racial justice and equality for African Americans. However, on Friday, we mark the legalization of abortion, a tragic legacy of injustice and violence. More work for overcoming injustice, inequality, and violence is needed.

Let's begin with prayers for a culture of life and a civilization of love. Let us take up prayers for peace and love so needed in our world as we voice our petitions for the protection of unborn children. Stay safe. Be well. Do good. God Bless.

What is the Natural Law?

When Thomas Jefferson wrote in the Declaration of Independence, "We hold these truths to be self-evident..." he demonstrated our founding fathers' belief that the morality of certain principles, and actions, is knowable to all. We recognize that many people elsewhere in the world are not so fortunate, and many do not even recognize the same moral laws as us. But such differences do not point to a "moral relativism" in which nothing is really right or wrong in itself, but is only perceived as such by the people.

Instead, we as Christians hold that actions are definitively right or wrong based on whether they measure up with the will of God, who is consistent and unchanging as the fullness of all being, goodness, and truth. We assert that there is a divine moral law that all people must adhere to in order to live justly and well, and to make it back to God. This law is written into the workings of creation because God creates all beings and upholds the universe, designing and ordering all things such that they reflect His wisdom, and point back to Him. That the world itself, including our God-given minds and intellect, should lead us to believe in God, to know Him, and to know what is morally right and wrong suggests that anyone can come to know and follow the divine law.

It is written into nature and so we also call it "natural law". But we are also a fallen people and so our capacity for moral judgment can be easily clouded. Amid confusing circumstances we can easily see good things as bad or vice versa. Fortunately God helps us by revealing His will in the Ten Commandments, the teachings of Christ, and Church doctrine. We should follow these precepts and we can even use them to determine right and wrong in more ambiguous cases and in establishing civil laws.

In his Letter from Birmingham Jail Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. writes, "A just law is a man-made code that squares with the moral law or the law of God...an unjust law is a human law that is not rooted in eternal law and natural law. Any law that uplifts the human personality is just. Any law that degrades human personality is unjust." By "personality" MLK here means the design of the human person envisioned and created by God. In our Declaration of Independence our founding fathers stated that we have a right to the pursuit of happiness by all lawful means. The writers of that document did not mean that a person has a right to pursue happiness by any means. When they write, "lawful means" the law they had in mind was not the changeable laws of congress or the Supreme Court, but the eternal and unchanging law of nature.






