Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

Many people undertake diets to lose weight and get healthier. A trendy diet these days is the intermittent fast diet. This diet establishes an eating pattern that cycles between periods of fasting and eating. It doesn't specify which foods to eat but rather when to eat them. Standard intermittent fasting methods involve daily 16-hour fasts or fasting for 24 hours, twice per week. I leave it to the medical community to determine if such a diet is fruitful and healthy.

However, the fasting we take up during Lent is a spiritual fast. While we do fast from extra food on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday and abstain from eating meat on Fridays during Lent, our fasting is truly a call to sacrifice something not to become physically healthier but rather spiritually healthier.

We fast or give things up as a reminder to remove items in our lives that get in the way of our relationship with God. When we feel hungry or choose not to do things we desire, it reminds us that everything we have is a gift from God. We strive to hunger for more of God and less of self. Our fasting mirrors Christ's fast in the wilderness for forty days as we seek to hunger for what he hungers.

Fasting is more than giving up treats and pleasures. There are other things from which we should also fast. We can fast from noise by turning off TVs, computers, and phones. Instead pray in silence or come to First Friday Adoration.

In his outstanding book, The Power of Silence: Against the Dictatorship of

Noise, Robert Cardinal Sarah suggests: "Without silence, God disappears in the noise. And this noise becomes all the more obsessive because God is absent. Unless the world rediscovers silence, it is lost. The earth then rushes into nothingness." This Lent, we should fast from noise and rediscover silence.

Pope Francis urges fasting from gossip. He said: "It's so rotten, gossip. In the beginning, it seems to be something enjoyable and fun, like a piece of candy. But at the end, it fills the heart with bitterness and also poisons us."

We can fast from talking about our family members, friends, co-workers and neighbors. Idle gossip is not only hurtful at times its very sinful. Try fasting from gossip.

We can fast from "Busyness." Our culture grants a badge of honor to those who take up "busyness." However, being too busy often distracts us from other, more important things like family, faith and God. It prevents us from hearing God's voice and appreciating God's blessings. This Lent, slow down and pray. Don't be too busy to be with the Lord.

We should fast from complaining. How often do we complain about something we don't like or cannot accept? In Lent, try to be more grateful for what we have rather than complain about what we don't.

Crabby complaints and caustic criticism can be toxic, polluting the attitudes of those around us. They tear down rather than build up a community. Fasting from complaining calls us to be part of a solution rather than contribute to a problem.

Finally, we might fast from excuses. The parents of the great Yankee shortstop Derek Jeter never permitted him to use the word "can't" around the house. They suggested that anything was possible with hard work and dedication.

The virtue of hope reminds us that all things are possible with God. We can change, resist temptations, avoid sin, and follow the path of virtue and holiness. The Saints show us the way from sin to sanctity can indeed be done. This Lent, fast from saying "can't" to the Lord and embrace "I can" for Christ.

Next weekend welcome two very dynamic preachers, Dominican Friars Fr. James Mary Sullivan, OP, and Fr. Justin Mary Bolger, OP, for our Lenten Parish Mission. They are preaching at all the Masses, then each night preaching a Mission Talk at 7:00 pm. See the Mission schedule in the bulletin. The Mission entitled "Living for the Other Side," features music from the Hillbilly Thomists. This group is a band of Dominican Friars who play bluegrass music. Fr. Jordon, a talented musician. is a band member. The Mission is our time to retreat into prayer and reflection as we seek to convert more fully to Christ. Please join us either in person or via live stream.

A Word Missing?

Since Ash Wednesday a word has been missing from the prayers at the Mass. This seemingly small omission has important theological consequences. Whether we realize it or not one word can have a big effect. On February 4, 2021, the USCCB's Committee on Divine Worship decreed that in the English translation of the conclusion of collects (opening prayers) in the Roman Missal, "one" is to be omitted before "God." For example, at the end of the prayer the celebrant will now say: "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." This change took effect on Ash Wednesday this year.

There are a few reasons for this change. The USCCB's Committee note said that "there is no mention of 'one' in the Latin, and 'Deus' in the Latin text refers to Christ." Hence, omitting the word "one" more closely follows the wording and the grammar of the Latin text. Latin is the language of the Church. All official documents are translated from Latin into the vernacular languages. This is not just a holdover from times past, but preserves the communicability of Church teaching. Since Latin does not change, its words and grammar remain the same. They are not prone to the cultural shifts in meaning prevalent in our contemporary languages.

Removing the word "one" also avoids any connotation that Jesus is a distinct god from the other two persons of the Trinity. Likewise, the word "one" tends to suggest that Jesus is one God among many. Christ's divinity is identical with that of the other two persons in the Trinity. He is God completely, with no division or separation from the other two persons. And God is not merely one god among many. He is the only God. The identity of Christ is an essential part of our faith. Many people today incorrectly think of Christ as one spiritual guru among many. By removing one word, the Church preserves the identity of Christ for her people.

Finally, the word "one" is not used in the French, German, Italian, Spanish, or Portuguese translations of the Mass. So, the English translation of the Mass now follows the practice of the universal Church and brings us closer together with those who hear the Mass in a different tongue. One word can indeed have an important impact on our faith.

The Mission will be livestreamed each night at olmparish.org and also feature the music of *The Hillbilly Thomists*, a Bluegrass Band of Dominican Friars.




Fr. James Mary Sullivan, O.P., is a Dominican priest of the Province of Saint Joseph. He is a native of Boston, Massachusetts and graduated from Providence College in 1989. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1995. Father has served as Pastor at St. Dominic Church in Youngstown, Ohio and St. Louis Bertrand Church in Louisville, Kentucky. He has also taught theology at St. Joseph Seminary in Yonkers, New York and Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Cincinnati, Ohio. After serving as Novice Master for the St. Joseph Province for four years and directing 65 novices, he was assigned in 2014 to serve as the Director of the Priestly Sabbatical Program at the Pontifical North American College, Rome, Italy. Since 2019 Father Sullivan has served as Pastor of Saint Pius V Church in Providence. He also serves as adjunct Spiritual Director at Our Lady of Providence Seminary.



Fr. Justin Bolger, O.P. hails from Maryland where he grew up in a big Catholic family. He graduated from the University of Baltimore and then played music professionally with his sister Maggie. After a career in the music business he worked and studied at Mt. St. Mary's University in Emmitsburg, MD where he earned a masters in philosophy. He then joined the Dominicans in 2012. He obtained a Licentiate in Sacred Theology and was ordained to the priesthood in May 2020. He now serves as Associate Pastor of St. Pius V and in campus ministry at Providence College. His bluegrass band of Dominican Friars, The Hillbilly Thomists, have just released their newest album, "Living for the Other Side." Fr. Justin will be preaching and playing tunes from this album.
