

Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

Many Catholic schools in the U.S. are facing a crisis as over one hundred-thirty have already announced permanent closures. A recent survey of U.S. Catholic school principals showed that currently, 10% are uncertain about their ability to open in the fall; this equals hundreds of Catholic schools and thousands of families in turmoil

At OLM, we continue to advance toward the reopening of our parish school. Our plan is up on the school webpage. We've had virtual meetings with the faculty and parents to discuss the proposal. Our dedicated faculty is ready to return and offer their outstanding faith based academic instruction. Our students and their families are excited about coming back together in the classroom to learn once again!

I wish to commend and thank our dedicated OLM School Principal, Patrick McNabb, for his hard work in developing the plan. He has been tireless throughout the entire summer in ensuring our school can reopen safely and happily for our students this fall.

Our OLM Maintenance Staff continues to work so very hard to ensure our school is safe and healthy. We have installed Hepa Air Purifiers in every classroom and equipped all our school and church bathrooms with automatic faucets and toilets. Each class, with the teacher's plan, is set up to allow for safe distancing. Also, we have hired a Registered Nurse to serve as our OLM School Nurse and supervise the health and safety of our students.

As we have been doing

in Church, our school building will be cleaned and sanitized daily. We have been using Electrostatic sanitizing spraying. This cleaning requires a lot of time and diligence by our maintenance staff to ensure the safety of all.

Also, the maintenance staff have renovated the School Nurse Office and renovated another room to serve as an isolation room in case someone becomes ill during school. We are also in the process of installing webcams in every classroom so that online learning can happen simultaneously with in-person instruction. In addition to the usual summer cleaning of school building we've the replaced the ceiling tiles in the school gym stained with old leaks and installed new smoke detectors.

I am truly grateful for their hard work and dedication to keeping OLM safe and beautiful. They do all this plus maintain the entire physical plant. including the Church, Rectory, Mercy House, Mercy Convent, Franciscan Convent, and St. Patrick's Cemetery. If you see them around working, stop, and say thanks!

Of course, all these much needed projects come at a considerable expense for our Unfortunately, school. our Annual Spring Fling School Fundraiser was canceled due to the COVID-19 Lockdown in April. And we've also had to cancel our Annual Saints and Scholars Open OLM School Golf Tournament. These are the two largest fundraisers for our parish school and help to fund the many maintenance and

educational projects for the school year.

Because we cannot gather for either a Golf Tournament or for a Spring Fling, we are happily announcing the "See You In September" Raffle! Only 600 tickets are for sale for \$100 apiece. The \$10,000 in raffle prizes includes a Grand Prize of \$5,000 with additional prizes of \$2,500, 2 prizes of \$1,000 and one for \$500. The tickets are on sale this week, and the Raffle Drawing is to be live-streamed on Thursday, September 24th, the Feast of Our Lady of Mercy! It will be an exciting way to end our Parish Feast Week.

Was Jesus born knowing his fate or mission to save us by dying on the cross?

There have been many positions throughout the centuries concerning Christ's knowledge. Some have said that as an infant Jesus did not know his fate, but that as he grew up he gradually began to realize his fate at a certain point. Some have said that Jesus understood his fate to be something quite different than what the Church invented.

The Church teaches that Jesus always knew from birth what his mission or fate would be: to save us from our sins by dying on the cross and rising from the dead. We can appeal to several scriptural passages to support this position. There are several scriptural passages that show us that Jesus knew that he was God incarnate and that he knew his mission. Jesus states, "He who has seen me has seen the Father" (Jn. 14:9); "Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up" (Jn. 3:14); "But who do you say that I am?' Simon Peter said in reply, 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' Jesus said to him in reply, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah'' (Mt. 23:15-17); "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will" (Mt. 26:39).

How did Jesus know this? We know that Jesus is a divine person with human and divine Since he has a human nature he has natures. everything proper to it which includes (like us) a mind which learns. Theologians speak of three types of human knowledge in Christ: acquired, infused, and knowledge of the blessed. Jesus learned or acquired things in this life (e.g. the language), hence Luke writes of Jesus growing up "in wisdom and in stature" (Lk. 2:52). So there are some things that Jesus learned through experience. He also had infused knowledge (for example, knowledge of future events). Finally he had "knowledge of the blessed," which means that his human mind has direct knowledge of God because his mind was hypostatically joined to the divine nature. Is it a contradiction to say that Christ both knows things already and has to learn them? There is no contradiction because there are these distinct kinds of knowledge. Therefore by infused knowledge Christ already knows (e.g.) language through direct communication from God, but when he learns it from his parents this is through images or ideas in his mind.



Ambo



mbo is the name we give to the special lectern in our churches from which the Scriptures are proclaimed.

In the early church, this was a raised platform with a reading desk located somewhere in the midst of the assembly—an arrangement taken directly from what was customary in the synagogue.

The ambo became obsolete in the Middle Ages as the various ministries were assumed by a single priest who performed his various functions from different areas of a very long altar.

Restored to us by the reforms of Vatican II, ambos are now prominently located in all of our churches.

The ambo should be commanding in appearance and used only for the proclamation of the Scriptures, the preaching of the homily, and the singing of the Exsulter at the Easter vigil.
