Mercy Musings



Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we celebrate Catechetical Sunday. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only pray for our parish catechists who teach in the OLM Religious Education Program, but we also commend parents and families and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where faith is passed on to the next generation.

At the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday we are to commission the men and women who volunteer to teach the some 400 children of our parish about the Faith. Catechetical Catholic Sunday is wonderful a opportunity for every parishioner to reflect on the role they play, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. Catechetical Sunday is an opportunity for all to rededicate themselves to this mission as a community of faith.

Many Catholics have used the word "catechism" for years, and they know it has something to do with the compendium of the Church's teachings. The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life . . . her inner growth and correspondence with God's plan depend essentially on catechesis."

This ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity, which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others. In a very special way, we pray for our catechists and all those families enrolled in our Religious Education Program.

On Catechetical Sunday, we are also reminded that parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. It is Catholic Parents who must prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. So please pray for the parents of the children in our Religious Education Program, that they may strive to fulfill the promise they made on the day of their child's baptism to "teach them in the ways of the faith."

I wish to thank Mickey St. Jean and Doug Green who direct our OLM Religious Education Program. They do exemplary work in ensuring the teachings of Christ and His Church are taught to our parish children with zeal, integrity and joy. We must also thank the men and women who volunteer to serve as teachers in our RE Program for their service and sacrifice.

We thank the many families in our RE Program. They have chosen to prepare the future of our parish and Church by educating their children in the faith. We thank them for their willingness to ensure the faith is an important part of their family life and bringing their children to

Christ in this way.

Ours is a large program and it requires the work and dedication of many people along with the cooperation of the students and their families. We are grateful for their cooperation with our teachers and RE Directors. Working together to educate the children of OLM in the ways of the faith is critical to our parish life and future.

Pope Francis reminds parents: "We need simplicity to pray as a family! Praying the Our Father together, around the table. is not something extraordinary: it's easy. And praying the Rosary together, as a family, is very beautiful and a source of great strength! And also praying for one another! The husband for his wife, the wife for her husband, both together for their children, the children for their grandparents praying for each other. This is what it means to pray in the family and it is what makes the family strong: prayer!" May we pray for all OLM families and may all OLM families pray!

Is Anointing of the Sick effective without Confession?

As we read in the Letter of St. James: "Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to one another [that is, in the context of the elders of the church coming to you], and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects." (James 5:14-16). In the Rite of Anointing of the Sick we read a portion of this letter prior to administering the Sacrament. The ancient Church always saw in this letter and elsewhere: First, Christians must confess their sins to the ministers (i.e. priests) of the Church. Second: That the ministers of the Church received the authority of Christ (the "man" with the authority to forgive sins, that is, God Incarnate) to forgive sins. Whether arguing from a Catholic, Orthodox, or early Protestant perspective (that is, Lutheran and Anglican churches), that was the interpretation everyone accepted. The evangelical idea that you confess to God alone did not exist before people like Calvin and Zwingli--that is, not till 1500 years after the Resurrection.

abounds Confusion, however, administering or receiving the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Namely, people erroneously think that the Sacrament of Anointing automatically forgives sins. This is not necessarily the case. Those who are in grave or mortal sin must first repent and go to Confession before receiving the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. This is because the sacrament would not be effective otherwise. If a person is conscious and aware of mortal sins, then Confession should precede the Anointing. If, however, the person is unconscious or unable to make a complete confession because of illness, then forgiveness may be received through the Sacrament of Anointing. Such a person receives forgiveness of sins provided that prior to becoming unconscious or unable to respond, they repented of their sins. If the person is unconscious and is known to have obstinately persisted in grave sin up to the point of losing consciousness, with no sign of repentance, then the anointing will not have the desired effect. Granted, if such a person showed even an implicit sign of repentance (e.g. "call the priest"), then there is a hope that the anointing will bear fruit. This is based on the question: "would the person repent if they could."

These rules and conditions are not meant to keep people away from the sacraments (and therefore Christ). Instead the proper use and reception of the Sacraments ensures that a person enters into a relationship with Christ and understands the efficacy and meaning of the Sacraments. So to sum up: before receiving the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, should one go to Confession? If one is able, the answer is a resounding "yes."




