Why is there purgatory, another take?

One of the great misconceptions that inhabits Catholic thought today is the implicit denial of purgatory. We can find evidence of this sad reality in the fact that few pray for the dead or offer Masses (albeit OLM is a notable exception). No doubt certain remarks made in funeral homilies or by family and friends at funerals do not help clarify reality. Even if a person dies destined for heaven, that person still needs to be made ready to enter heaven. Just as our eyes need to adjust from darkness to bright light, our souls need to adjust from earthy existence to heavenly existence. As C.S. Lewis tells us in The Great Divorce, "Evil can be undone, but it cannot 'develop' into good. Time does not heal it. The spell must be unwound, bit by bit... It is still 'either-or.' If we insist on keeping Hell (or even earth) we shall not see Heaven: if we accept Heaven we shall not be able to retain even the smallest and most intimate souvenirs of Hell." We call the place where our souls receive adjustment Purgatory.

The sacrament of Confession forgives sins and restores the soul to a state of grace. Even so the attachment to sin, and the disorder incurred from the sin remain. The attachment needs to be removed (e.g. I may sorrowfully regret my gluttony, but I am still tempted to eat cake excessively), and the disorder perfected. The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls this satisfaction. "Absolution takes away sin, but it does not remedy all the disorders sin has caused. Raised up from sin, the sinner must still recover his full spiritual health by doing something more to make amends for the sin: he must 'make satisfaction for' or 'expiate' his sins. This satisfaction is also called 'penance'" (CCC 1459). Satisfaction must occur either in this life or in Purgatory. Satisfaction depends on a person's union with Christ (i.e. the person must be in a state of grace). "Good deeds" separate from Christ do not save a person.

Just because a person does good deeds in life or even suffers in this life does not mean that they perform acts which make them ready for heaven. We do not save ourselves, Christ is the one who saves us; and we are saved insofar as we are united to Christ. The idea that we save ourselves is repugnant to the faith and known as the early heresy Pelagianism. A person who performs good deeds, but at the same time renounces Jesus does not buy their way into heaven with good deeds.

Perhaps the idea that our loved ones do not immediately enter heaven gives us pause or even despair. Yet, purgatory is part of the Good News of Jesus Christ. Purgatory means that acts of prayer, suffering, sacrifice, almsgiving, fasting, etc. may be done for our loved ones who have gone before us. Death does not separate us from helping our loved ones. Instead we may help them get ready for heaven. In fact praying for the dead is a necessary part of being a follower of Christ. Perhaps you have a loved one or spouse, who you have only just realized did so much for you. Suddenly you remember, I may still pay my spouse back and help him get ready for heaven. The best way we help our deceased loved ones is the Mass.

Cross




A cross, the basic symbol of Christianity, is to be visible at all liturgical celebrations.

This cross may be a permanent one, or it may be a processional cross carried in and out at the beginning and end of each celebration.

Because we human beings tend to lose sight of permanent fixtures and pay more attention to objects that are made present for a specific purpose, many communities that have recently built or renovated their worship spaces have favored the processional cross.

The latest Vatican directives, however, strongly suggest that a cross be on display in the sanctuary at all times and very specifically indicate that the liturgical cross, whether fixed or processional, bear an image of Christ crucified.


