

May a Catholic be Cremated?

The quick and easy answer is that the Church does not forbid cremation, unless it is chosen for reasons that are contrary to Christian teaching. In fact if a person were to choose cremation for reasons which go against our Lord's teaching, such a person would not be fit for a funeral (since at that point they have, essentially, renounced his teachings). What would these reasons be? For instance, one reason is the disbelief in the resurrection from the dead at the end of the world. Other reasons would be a disdain for the body, thinking that the material world is evil, wanting to spread the ashes over the ocean or keep them at home (usually this implies a strange anthropology, and a mistaken view that we become one with the universe), and so on.

Historically and even today the Church prefers burial of a body over cremation and advocates for it as much as possible. Cremation should not be seen as another equal option, but something chosen due to perhaps a lack of finances (funerals are incredibly expensive), a distant place of burial (the person wants to be buried back in a home country), and so on. These are very practical, non-theological concerns.

The reason why the Church prefers burial of a body has its roots in theology and this has not changed. Since Catholics believe in the resurrection of the dead, and the dignity of the human body as created by God, it is only logical that Catholicism also holds that the body of a deceased person should be handled with respect. Consequently, burning it has not traditionally been considered acceptable treatment. For a while the Church forbade cremation because of its close association with paganism, which did not believe in the resurrection. This is the reason for the early Christians in Rome burying their dead separately in the catacombs. In the past it was automatically assumed that a Catholic who had himself/herself cremated had abandoned hope in the resurrection of the body or was actively mocking it.




Baptism of the Lord



he feast of the Baptism of the Lord, our commemoration of the institution of the sacrament of baptism, is the last feast of the Christmas season and is usually observed on the Sunday following January 6.

The calendar sometimes causes it to fall on a Monday, but in its usual Sunday slot, it offers an excellent opportunity for parishes to focus on baptism by using the rite of blessing and sprinkling holy water or to celebrate the sacrament during Mass, especially if this not the usual custom.

The Baptism of the Lord launches us right into winter Ordinary Time with its concentration on the earlier public life and preaching of Jesus.




